New players, coaches clinic set for Sunday

The Badger Region is offering the first of two coaches and players clinics at 1 p.m. Sunday, April 23, at the New Berlin SportsPlex.

The youth player clinic will be open to any athlete ages 11-14 interested in a general skills clinic that will be led by members of the Milwaukee Dive semi-professional team men's VLA team.

The coaches clinic will be open to any coach or parent interested in getting into coaching or wanting to refresh their coaching skills heading into the middle school season that is coming up. One aspect of the coaches clinic will be how to start a youth program that would fit well in the Badger Region Youth Fall Volleyball League or as how to start a club program during the "regular" club season November through April. New or recently new club directors are encouraged to attend this event.

During the first hour of the clinic, coaches will work specifically with Badger Region staff on learning coaching and directing best practices. The first half of the clinic will focus on technique and basics for the youth athletes.

During the second hour of the clinic, the coaches will be brought into the gym to watch as the Milwaukee Dive team puts the athletes into more competitive drills that simulate game play.

Cost to attend the clinic as a player or a coach is \$20. All players will receive a t-shirt. All adults who attend will receive a coaching binder and other Badger Region swag.

State's college club teams wrap up season on high notes

The 30th Annual WVC Championships took place April 7-8 at the Milwaukee Sting Center in Menomonee Falls. Forty-three college club teams gathered from Wisconsin, Michigan, Minnesota, and South Dakota and competed for the right to be called "Champions" in four divisions (Men's D1, Women's D1, Men's D2, and Women's D2).

In Men's Division 1, it was UW-Oshkosh once again asserting itself as the top team in the league. The Titans went 3-0 in pool play, earning a bye to the semi finals where they defeated UW-La Crosse 25-21, 25-22. In the Championship match UW-O defeated #1 seed UW-Eau Claire 25-23, 25-19. Middle blocker Seth Kurkowski was named the tournament MVP with setter David Paul and rightside Cade Coenen joining him on the all-tournament team. Other All Tournament Team selections included: Matt Schulte (UWM), Danny Bellnapp (UWL), Trey Myers (UWEC), and Mason Mortimer (UWEC).

Women's Division 1 saw UW-La Crosse soar to the title for the second consecutive year as the Eagles went 3-0 in pool play before defeating South Dakota St., in an exciting match, in the semis (25-10, 22-25, 15-9) and Winona St in the finals (25-22, 25-17). Middle Blocker Gaby Garcia was named Tournament MVP with Setter, Kenize Krach and Right Side, Hannah Powers joining her on the all-tournament team. Other all-tournament team selections included: Taylor Hullman (WSU), Lexi Steffes (WSU), Trista Baustian (SDSU), and Molly Crandall (UWEC).

In Men's Division 2 it was UW-Milwaukee 2 who fought their way through the field. The Panthers went 2-1 in pool play (with their lone loss coming to UW-Green Bay placing them on the opposite side of the bracket). UW-M defeated UW-River Falls in a tightly contested semi final 25-22, 25-23 while benefiting from UW-Whitewater knocking off UW-GB in the other semi. Milwaukee kept the momentum going by hanging on to defeat the Warhawks 17-25, 25-23, 15-13 in the championship match. Setter/RS Bennett Woodliff was named tournament MVP with teammates Benji Seaman (OH) and Payton Seymour (L) joining on the all-tournament team. Other All Tournament Team selections included: Michael Haverkorn (UWRF), Ben Heller (UWGB), Luke Martinson (UWW), and Tyler Lynch (UWW).

In Women's Division 2 UW-La Crosse 2 was dominant throughout the tournament and did not lose a match. A 3-0 finish in pool play setup a quarterfinal match with Northern Michigan who they defeated 25-17, 25-17. In the semis the Eagles took down UW-Eau Claire 2 in a match that went the distance by defeating the Blugolds 25-15, 20-25, 18-16. UW-L regained its dominant form with a 25-19, 25-15 sweep of UW-Stevens Point 2 to claim the championship. Middle Blocker Mya Burdick took home MVP honors with setter Emmy Benson and outside hitter Clarissa Aulik also being named to the all tournament team. Other All Tournament Team selections included: Hallie Roschen (UWRF2), Clare Swoboda (UWEC2), Paige Erickson (UWSP2), McKenzie Parnewicz (UWSP2).

The event also hosted its annual season awards ceremony which included all-conference awards, Scholar Athlete winners, programs of the year, the WVC Service award, Leif Storvif Sportsmanship Award and more. A complete list of award winners will be posted on the WVC website.

National Collegiate Volleyball Federation Championships

Last weekend 23 teams from the Wisconsin Volleyball Conference went Kansas City for the NCVF Championships. After three days of play, two WVC teams came home as NATIONAL CHAMPIONS!

Congratulations to the University of Wisconsin Eau Claire Women's team for successfully defending their title from a year ago. The Blugolds came in as the #2 seed overall and went 9-0 in matches while only being extended to a third set once (by Emory in a championship power pool). In Gold bracket play, UWEC marched through Indiana U PA (25-13, 25-12), before facing familiar faces and WVC counterparts UW-River Falls (25-14, 25-21) in the quarterfinals and UW-La Crosse (25-14, 25-20) in the semis. This pitted Eau-Claire versus tournament #1 seed Colorado Christian University on championship court, in the Kansas City Municipal Auditorium, where the Blugolds never flinched, winning 25-23, 25-19 to become 2x National Champions! Claire Caswell was named MVP with teammates Samantha Strelnieks and Jordan Pagac also being named to the 1st Team all tournament along with Kenzie Krach (UWL) and Hannah Powers (UWL).

A total of 11 WVC Women's athletes were named All-Americans; a full list of WVC, 2023 NCVF All-Americans can be found <u>HERE</u>.

In Men's Division 2 play it was a rematch of last year's national championship match between UW-La Crosse and UW-Eau Claire. Both teams looked dominant throughout the weekend, entering the finals with unblemished records. UWEC did not drop a set en route to the championship match and held its opponents in the gold bracket to an average of 20 pts/set. UW-L was pushed to a third set only once (by St. Thomas University) before sweeping all its opponents in the gold bracket.

However this time around the Eagles of UW-La Crosse would not be denied. Led by National Player of Year Danny Bellnapp and strong play out of the middle from Nicholas Voet & Xavier Stueber UW-L became National Champions with a 25-22, 25-19 victory in a match that never really seemed that close. UW-La Crosse was awarded for its strong play with 5, First Team All-Americans: Bellnapp (MVP), Christian Brayer (L), Joey Mahan (OH), Keegan Kearby (S), and Nicholas Voet (MB). Also named to the first team were Carson Bakkala (MB, UWEC), Beau Sweitzer (RS, UWEC), and Mason Mortimer (OH, UWEC). In total 21 WVC Men's athletes were awarded All-American honors; the full list can be found HERE.



How is the Badger Region Board structured?


The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve fouryear terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities). The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:
