Medal-winning player now a medal-winning coach

Jessica Huber knows what it's like to be a be a Badger Region Champion.

The RVA 16-Navy Assistant Coach and RVA 10-Navy Head Coach has now won hardware at the Region Championships as both a coach and a player.

Huber took the time to answer some questions for the Badger Beacon:

Growing up I played at multiple clubs but RVA was the one I stayed the longest/finished at but most importantly the one I called "my volleyball home" because of the coaches, the friendships and the many memories created.

What made you want to come back and coach?

Since my time at RVA and after playing and being the president of the UW-Whitewater women's club volleyball team, I knew it was always a dream to come back and coach where my best volleyball memories were created.

One of these memories being the 2016 Badger Region championships. It was my first season (15s) with RVA with coach Sean Curley, and it was a day I truly will never forget. Making it to the championship was a dream in itself. Went from having a hard fought battle against Capital, the adrenaline rush of game point, the win and the team storming the court into one big pile, and to getting the first place medals put on us.

Describe what it's like to be on the other side:

Now that I am back, coaching girls 16 Navy along side coach Heather Curley, I



was asked to wear my medal this year to show my players and to remind them of my experience. During a time out one of the girls grabbed the medal and said "this is what we are playing for." To bring these girls to the semi finals was a flashback and a dream I had for them. Although not the outcome



we wanted, we still walked away with a third place finish and a medal that I hope they keep out and are proud of, just like I did all these years.

What is your message to your athletes?

Since my time playing has come to a close, I have always told my girls to play every game likes it's your last because you never know. I would do ANYTHING to be in their position just to play one more game but being able to watch them play brings me back and makes me feel like I am playing again through them.

I get to share my passion for the game and there's nothing more rewarding than that.

I coach for the love of the game, and to be able to give these girls an experience they will never forget, just like I never forgot.

Graduating students can apply for Badger Region scholarships

How is the Badger Region Board structured?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve four-year terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they

think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities).

The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:


