Athletes shine at Last-Chance Tryout

Close to 40 athletes attended the girls 14-and-under Last-Chance Tryout hosted by the Badger Region on Thursday, Oct. 12.

The event was organized by the Badger Region and used staff and ambassadors from the Milwaukee Gold men's semi-professional team to run the courts at the New Berlin SportsPlex.

In attendance were eight different volleyball clubs from southeast Wisconsin who were looking to fill a handful of rosters spots at their respective organizations.

"The energy throughout the night was excellent. Music played throughout the gym. It was a great time," said program director Brian Sharkey. "No offers were given on site so there wasn't any sort of stigma of seeing athletes get pulled off to the side and get offers or paperwork or any of that."

All attendees were members of the Badger Region and did not have a confirmed

4C's and their impact on volleyball athletes

The game of volleyball is filled with many intense and competitive moments, which is one of the most attractive things about playing the sport for many athletes. Volleyball is also a layered and complicated sport with constant opportunities for earning points but also giving up points.

Teams can find themselves on the offensive attack for long bouts and then moments later they are digging on defense for several plays. This leads me to the main focus of this article which is bringing light to the 4 C's and how they are well connected to the game of volleyball. When the 4C's are well mastered, a volleyball player becomes more complete and well-rounded as an athlete.

Challenges

When experiencing the full impact of volleyball in action, there is rarely the absence of challenges. Competitive challenges allow teams to work through various ups and downs of difficult experiences by learning to collaboratively work together for the best possible outcome. When we can view challenges as opportunities to learn and grow our athletes, we see them improve and learn to embrace challenges. The need for consistent and constant communication appears to be one of the most important on the list of challenges in the game of volleyball. For athletes to continuously grow, they need to rise to the challenge of increasing their communication skills.



Choices

A volleyball game is loaded with opportunities to make a variety of choices and decisions. Some lead the team in a positive direction, and others affect the game negatively. Volleyball is unique in that it's the only sport where you cannot control the ball for more than a split second of contact and you're relying on your teammates to execute the contact before and/or after you. Every choice you make is a split second and then the ball is gone. We need to realize that with all choices comes the ability to learn, grow, and be better as people. When volleyball players can handle the outcomes of various choices, they learn that vulnerability and setbacks often allow growth to take place. Teams who have players who can do this well often see steady progress and success.

Chances

Often we hear people say "get comfortable being uncomfortable" when they reference taking chances. In the game of volleyball, they are referring to developing the ability to gain confidence in new and unique experiences that may make you uncomfortable because they are unfamiliar. Learning how to navigate newness is an art and a science happening at the same time. A combination of challenges, choices, and taking chances allows for growth in a young athlete. This impacts various aspects of being a good critical thinker and problem solver. Taking chances and calculated risks develops a strong confidence that you can do anything you put your mind to. If you are on a passionate and competitive journey as a volleyball player, you will be head to head with chance taking forks in the road.

Changes

The game of volleyball is always changing. We need to keep up with changes and eliminate blaming and complaining when we self-reflect. We must also examine things that involve the idea of change. Change can be extremely difficult but is often very necessary to stretch us to new places and new ideas. Oftentimes, we need to look at our mindset and determine if we are fixed or open in regards to how we negotiate change. Becoming a good volleyball player is a product of acknowledging that change is necessary. As a valued volleyball teammate, this concept heightens to new levels, and it is crucial you understand how your teammates are changing and growing with you.

Gaining a deeper understanding of the 4C's can tremendously impact your game as a volleyball player and move you towards more success both as a player and as a teammate. Volleyball is such an exciting sport and has many wonderful attributes and ties to life lessons. I hope this helps you maximize your impact as a volleyball player.


The Badger Region currently has an online store open through Burghardt Sporting Goods.

USA Volleyball age-definition chart





The Badger Region Volleyball Association wants to make sure your team's jerseys are compliant with all rule sets and changes that have gone into effect.



The photos of the jerseys should not be of any junior athlete in uniform.

Reminder: All numbers must clearly contrast with the color of the jersey, regardless of the color of the outline of the number.

BACKGROUND SCREENINGS

All adult staff members require a full background screening that includes the following:

* Social Security Number validation;

* Name and address history records;

* Two independent Multi-Jurisdictional Criminal Database searches covering 50 states plus DC, Guam, and Puerto Rico;

* Federal District Courts search for each name used and district where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable;

* County Criminal Records for each name used and county where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available and reportable for each county searched;

* National Sex Offender Registry database search of all available states, plus DC, Guam, and Puerto Rico;

- * Multiple National Watch Lists;
- * SafeSport Disciplinary Records;

* Comprehensive International Records search for U.S. citizens who have lived outside of the United States for six consecutive months in any one country, during the past seven years;

* Motor Vehicle Records of at least a 3-year history in the state of licensure; (if driving is required for position).



How is the Badger Region Board structured?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve fouryear terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities). The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:
