### Recommended guidance if a team attempts to protest judgment

As you're aware, USAV 5.1.2.1 has been revised to include the following:

Judgment decisions are not subject to protest. A protest related to a judgment decision may result in a penalty (red card) being assessed to the coach

The following guidance should assist you in handling these situations. The first thing you should do before going courtside is making sure what your protest procedure is if there is a protestable situation.

• If there is a protest commit-

If a coach requests a protest that you aren't sure is judgment-related, remind the coach that judgment protests are not allowed. If the protest committee rules that it is judgment-related, they may (emphasis in bold, as it's not necessarily automatic) issue an individual red card (penalty). Any further sanction to said coach would result in an expulsion. If the coach still wants to protest, accept the protest,

and the committee will rule appropriately. It will be up to the protest committee to decide if the penalty will be assessed.

### • If there is no protest committee:

Ask your tournament director or assignor how they want you to handle this situation! Only issue a red card if you have been told you may do that. Follow the guidance given by the TD or assignor.

If they approve you being able to issue the penalty for a judgment

protest, follow the guidance that you would follow if a protest committee is present (remind the coach of the penalty that may be assessed for a judgment protest), and only assess the penalty if you are 100% sure the protest was judgment-related. If you are not sure, deny the protest and move on.

# CAUGHT DOING GOOD

### UW-Oshkosh commit goes above and beyond in her role as an official

he start of the season is a unique experience for everyone in the volleyball community.

There is newness and uncertainty among athletes, coaches and officials alike.

But one young official went above and beyond to make the experience a positive one for the athletes and coaches who came across her court.

That's why this week's Caught Doing Good honor goes to official Malayna Dins, a senior at Winnebago Lutheran Academy and a resident of Mount Calvary, Wis.

Dins was Caught Doing Good at the first weekend of the Badger Region Power League.

"The first tournament of the year can always be a little intimidating for the girls to be the work crew," the nomination said. "We had great officials all weekend, but Malayna really created a comfortable environment for the girls. She made eye contact with the girls every time she needed something from them and was patient if it took them a little bit to make their entries on the scoresheet."

What stood out was Dins' support of her work crew.

"When a coach argued about a

call, Malayna told the line judge 'you are doing a great job. You are paying attention and were confident in your call. I have no reason to not trust you. I have your back," the nomination said. "Her support and demeanor helps take some of the anxiety out of working and helps girls build their confidence. Great job."

Dins is graduating high school early and is committed to the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh to continue her athletic and academic career. She'll begin at Oshkosh in early February, and that is why she wasn't able to play club volleyball her senior year.

"I have been playing club since I was 11 years old," Dins said in an interview. "I think the relationships I remember having with officials when I was playing made me want to take up the challenge of being a ref myself."

bands at events and tournaments, and we're looking to hand out hundreds more.
