Region unveils coaches for HP All-Star program

The Badger Region High Performance All-Star program has announced its travel coaches for its six teams headed to the USA All-Star Championships in July.

These coaches were selected by a committee after sending in an application, their coaching resume and a statement of their coaching philosophies.

The Badger Region wants to thank all of the coaches who applied to be a High Performance All-Star lead coach for the 2024 season and looks forward to seeing our coaches (and athletes) in action this summer.

Girls U19 coaches

The Girls U19 team will be led by head coach Abbey Sutherland, the head women's volleyball coach at the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay. Sutherland is in her third year with the Region's HP All-Star program and led the U17 team to a Gold medal in 2022 in Tulsa, Okla.

She will be assisted by Amber Dunn, the former UW-La Crosse women's coach who

CAUGHT DOING GOOD

MVC boys coach sets high standards on and off court

Coaches who show support on and off the court are a sign of outstanding leaders who understand the role of sports in a young person's life.

And Milwaukee Volleyball Club coach Joe Coplan embodies that -- and more.

Coplan is the first recipient of a 2024 Caught Doing Good recognition from the Badger Region after being nominated for the award by a parent within the organization.

"Joe builds up passion for the sport and

pushes the boys to be better," the nomination said. "He recognizes the importance of academics and checks in with the boys to make sure they are doing well in other aspects of life beyond volleyball."

Coplan has made it his mission to help his young athletes succeed at life outside of volleyball.

"Coaching our youth allows me to teach young athletes the in's and out's of volleyball that I have picked up on over the course of my career," Coplan said after learning about being nominated for the Caught Doing Good award. "Coaching gives me the opportunity to

influence my players' lives and experiences in a positive and encouraging manner. I feel that it is necessary to not only coach my players into intelligent and successful athletes but to also coach them up to succeed at life outside of the volleyball court."

Coplan, a 2014 graduate of Marquette University High School, has coached a multiple levels within MVC and is also an assistant coach for the Lakeland University men's volleyball team.

Milwaukee Volleyball Club Director Brian Rushmer, who is also the head men's volleyball coach at Lakeland, said Coplan always goes above and beyond and is a favorite coach among many players.

"Joe has amazing intra-personal skills that makes him relate so well to the players he coaches," Rushmer said. "He really sets himself apart from other coaches by being so well rounded and doing what is right for the team."

"He genuinely cares about his players and their success in life on and off the court," the nominator added. "We are lucky to have him!

assisted Suthlerand in 2023 Fort Lauderdale in her first year with the program. The 2023 U17 team they coached together took fourth in the USA All-Star Championships. The U19 team will also be assisted by Samie Rielly, the assistant women's coach at Wisconsin Lutheran College. This will be Rielly's first year as a travel coach but is her third year in the program.

Girls U17 coaches

The U17 girls team will be led by Leigh Barea, the head women's coach at the University of Wisconsin-Parkside. This is Barea's fifth year with the program, during which time she has served as a head coach and assistant coach of the U15 team. Barea will be assisted by UW-Whitewater assistant coach Keith Scheckel, who has been a camp coach with both the boys and girls All-Star program. Rounding out their roster will be Lisa Kain, the club director and coach for One Wisconsin. This is Kain's second year with the All-Star program.

Girls U15 coaches

Emily Riese will lead the U15 girls team, the same group of athletes (born in 2010-11) who she helped guide to a bronze medal at the 2023 USA All-Star Championships in Fort Lauderdale. She will again be assisted by Maizie Wenger. Both Riese and Wenger are coaches at Fond du Lac Fusion. Their coaching roster will be rounded out by Breit Nelson, a Wisconsin Ice coach/director and a member of the Badger Region Board of Directors. This is Nelson's fourth year with the program.

Boys U19 coaches

The U19 boys will be led by Carthage College men's coach JW Kieckhefer, who has led the Region's oldest boys team for three years now, winning gold in 2022. He will be assisted by St. Norbert College men's and women's coach BJ Bryant, a staple in the Badger Region All-Star program for almost 20 years.

Boys U17 coaches

This season, the U17 head coach will be Mike Endsley, the head men's volleyball coach at Wisconsin Lutheran College. This is Endsley's fourth year with the program. He will be assisted by Concordia University Wisconsin men's coach Curtis Madson who is in his sixth year with the All-Star program and is also a gold medal winner from the 2022 coaching roster. Rounding out the roster is Carthage College assistant coach Mike Stevens, who is also a club director at Southport VBC and a coach at the club. Stevens is in his third year as a travel coach and fifth all together.

Boys 15 coaches

Leading the Region's first-ever U15 boys team is Rob Kleinschmidt, who is in his fourth year with the All-Star program. Rob, a former collegiate coach, will be assisted by his wife, Sue. Both Kleinschmidts have been longtime club coaches having worked at Lake Country, Southport and Motion along the way. They are also involved with the Middleton High School program. They will be joined by Dylan Griffith, head coach for the Middleton High School boys team, and recent state champion. Griffith also participated in the All-Star program as a player multiple times during his junior playing career.

If you attend a tournament that does not have officials or only has officials for a portion of the day, there might be an explanation. If an event only requests officials for semi-finals and finals, coaches will likely be expected to officiate without pay, so please be aware of this. If an event abides by the Badger Region's posted deadlines and requests professional officials all day and the region is unable to fulfill the request, the event should handle payment of coaches who officiate.

If however you are at an event that is not sanctioned by the Badger Region, you are not guaranteed to be paid if you as a coach are required to officiate as an R1.

HP All-Star tryouts, other details announced

The best of the best are coming together in 2024 for the <u>Badger Region High Performance All-Star program.</u>

That means elite athletes from clubs around the state. Top coaches from colleges and clubs from around the Badger Region. And all topped with an international tournament experience not offered at any other level of junior volleyball.

And that starts with our first round of announcements having to do with tryout, training dates and overnight camps that lead up to the culminating USA All-Star Championships where Badger Region All-Star teams will compete against a full slate of other Region All-Star teams and All-Star teams from international delegations.

Tryouts (register here)

Athletes in the following age groups are eligible to try out for a spot in the Badger Region HP All-Star program in 2024.

- U19: Boys and Girls born in 2006 and 2007
- U17: Boys and Girls born in 2008 and 2009
- U15: Boys and Girls born in 2010, 2011 and elite level athletes born in 2012

This will be the first time the Region offers a Girls U19 team, and it is the first time the Region is offering a Boys U15 team.

Tryouts will take place on the following dates:

- March 1: Girls U15, U17 and U19 at the Alliant Center in Madison prior to the Badger Region Qualifier (6 p.m.)
- March 15: Boys U15, U17 and U19 at the Baird Center (formerly the Wisconsin Center) in downtown Milwaukee prior to the Badger Region Championships (6 p.m.)
- March 22: Girls U15, U17 and U19 at the Baird Center (formerly the Wisconsin Center) in downtown Milwaukee prior to the Badger Region Championships (6 p.m.)
- Video submissions for tryouts will be considered on a case-by-case basis

Cost of tryouts is \$40 and includes a tryout t-shirt. To register for tryouts, click here.

From the tryouts, 30 athletes in each age group will be brought in for training dates (listed below) with their respective age/gender. An age group consists of athletes born in two years. For example, 30 athletes are chosen in the U19 age group who are born in 2006 and 2007. That doesn't mean 30 kids from 2006 and 2007. That means 30 kids total.

Who should attend tryouts? The Badger Region HP All-Star program is for elite athletes who want to be considered for a spot on an international volleyball team representing the state of Wisconsin. All participants must be a current Badger Region member.

Girls training dates

Changes to the traditional training schedule need to happen for the Badger Region HP





All-Star program due to the timing of USA Volleyball's Girls Junior National Championships and the dates for the USA All-Star Championships. Since there are only six days between the last day of GJNCs in Las Vegas and the departure date for the All-Star event in Iowa, the girls program will be modifying its schedule.

The tentative girls training dates are as follows:

- May 4 or May 5: Training date at site TBA
- May 11: Training date at site TBA

The coaching staff will narrow down their group of 30 to the 12 athletes who will be offered spots on the travel team after May 11. The 12 athletes chosen for the team and a handful of alternates will come together July 14-15 for an overnight camp at a site TBA.

Costs of the training dates and overnight camp will be announced soon.

Boys training dates

Coaches will pick 24-30 athletes per age

group and bring them to one-day training sessions as follows:

- April 21 at the New Berlin SportsPlex
- May 5 at the New Berlin SportsPlex
- June date (if needed)

The athletes chosen for the travel teams will come together July 14-15 at a site TBA for an overnight camp.

Costs of the training dates and overnight camp will be announced soon.

All-Star Championships

The USA-All-Star Championships will be held July 18-21 in Des Moines, Iowa. The Badger Region delegation will depart the morning of July 17 and return the morning of July 22. Cost of the trip to Iowa is TBD.

Are your team's jerseys compliant?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association wants to make sure your team's jerseys are compliant with all rule sets and changes that have gone into effect.

To do so, the Region's Ref Chair is encouraging club directors or coaches to send images if there is any concern that numbers are not contrasting enough with the dominant color of the jersey or if a jersey is not contrasting for libero purposes.

The photos of the jerseys

should not be of any junior athlete in uniform.

Reminder: All numbers must clearly contrast with the color of the jersey, regardless of the color of the outline of the number.

If your team plans to attend a USA Volleyball Boys or Girls Qualifier or National Championship, the Region can also help direct you as to the proper channels you must go through to get jersey waivers.







Board approves changes to tryouts

Region clubs allowed to offer a summer tryout

The Badger Region Board of Directors met Nov. 20, and voted to allow an additional tryout and commitment period to take place in the summer starting with the 2024-25 club volleyball season while maintaining the October and November tryout and commitment periods that are currently in place.

The following motion was approved by the Board 11-1 and will be effective July 1, 2024.

The Badger Region will allow clubs to open tryouts to all ages and gender of athletes on the second Saturday after the conclusion of the final day of the USA Volleyball Girls Junior National Championships (GJNC) or Boys Junior National Championships (BJNC) (whichever is later). All tryouts must be completed by 11:59 p.m. CT the Sunday before the start of the WIAA season. If an athlete receives an offer from a club, it must be honored until 7 p.m. CT Aug. 1. Any offer made after that time is at the discretion of the club.

Summer tryouts must be concluded once high school season begins. If a club holds a tryout during the regular fall tryout period, they may do so the first Saturday in October for athletes 14-and-younger, or the Saturday after the conclusion of the WIAA state volleyball tournament (15-and-older). Clubs must honor their offers until the Monday after the tryout period at 7 p.m. Any offers made after 7 p.m. are at the discretion of the club.

Clubs can offer a retention offer to those athletes who played for their club that season for the following club season to athletes starting on July 1 through seven days after the final day of the GJNC or BJNC (whichever is later).

Details

The second Saturday after the last day of the GJNC and BJNC would allow a minimum of at least eight days for an athlete to recover from the end of their season. It will also allow some time for athletes and families to consider pos-



sible retention offers they may have received, and mirrors tryout policies from neighboring regions.

The policy allows clubs to host tryouts for all ages and genders during the summer tryout period while still retain-

ing the fall tryout periods. Clubs may choose to host tryouts during any or all of the available periods. The updated policy does not mandate that a club hold tryouts during the summer tryout period; this is up the discretion of each individual club.

The Aug. 1 commitment date allows a longer tryout period and will allow athletes to attend multiple tryouts possibly over two weekends. This gives athletes and families to try out at multiple locations and not have to race from club to club on just one day of tryouts. The Aug. 1 deadline gives clubs and athletes two weeks before the high school season starts.

Moving the retention period to July 1 through seven days after the final day of the GJNC or BJNC allows clubs who choose not to participate in the summer tryout period to retain athletes. The summer tryout period and summer retention appeal to athletes who want to know what club they will train with and compete with after their high school or middle school seasons.

If a club chooses to host a tryout in the summer period, they can then advertise for

available team openings for the fall tryout periods. Allowing a summer tryout gives clubs additional planning time to organize their resources to prepare for the upcoming club volleyball season.

Timeline

These policies will go into effect for the 2024-25 season, with the applicable dates below for the coming season

- 1. Retention will open July 1, 2024, for the 2024-25 season the last day of the 2024 GJNC / BJNC will be July 11.
- 2. The last day a retention offer can be signed will be July 18.
 - 3. The first allowed dates for tryouts will be July 20
- 4. The first commitment date will be Aug. 1. Any offers made after this date are at the discretion of the club.
- 5. The last allowed date of summer tryouts will be Aug. 18.
 - 6. WIAA (high school) season starts Aug. 19
- 7. Fall tryouts can start Oct. 5 for 14-and-under (Commitment date: Oct.7)
- 8. Fall tryouts can start Nov. 16 for 15-and-older (Commitment date: Nov. 18)

More details about how official commitments will be made and other logistical adjustments will be published once they are finalized.

The Badger Region appreciates all of the time spent by the tryout committee, board members, club directors and others during this several year process. Numerous surveys of families and clubs, club director listening sessions and almost two years of planning went into the decision made by the Board of Directors.

Region to host 2025 All-Star event

Madison chosen for elite tournament

The Badger Region Volleyball Association and the Madison Area Sports Commission (MASC) are proud to announce that Madison and the Alliant Energy Center have been selected to host the 2025 USA Volleyball All-Star Championships. The event will feature All-Star teams from across the country composed of boys and girls players, ages 13-19, as well as officials from around the nation.

Madison was selected from various sites around the country by the participating programs. It will be the first time a Wisconsin city has hosted this prestigious event since 2010, when it was held in Wisconsin Dells.

"We are very proud to be hosting this event in Madison, in partnership with the Madison Area Sports Commission," said Badger Region Volleyball Executive Director and Commissioner Jennifer Armson-Dyer. "Wisconsin is a hotbed of volleyball at all levels, and to be able to bring this event to our local community is very rewarding. We're looking forward to showing the juniors volleyball community what Madison is about."

The event will take place in late July 2025 at the Alliant Energy Center and will feature four days of competition across nine divisions of both boys and girls volleyball ages 13-19. More than 100 participating teams will come from the 40 regions of USA Volleyball along with international teams. In the past, teams from Canada, Puerto Rico, Australia and New Zealand have attended the event.

Not only will players, coaches and spectators travel from around the nation to Madison, but officials will as well. Each participating region sends experienced and up-and-coming officials to work the event and be mentored by world-class officials to gain experience officiating high-level volleyball and making important connections to further

their careers.

"Hosting this prestigious tournament in Madison -- one of the epicenters of volleyball has long been a goal of ours," said Jamie Patrick, VP of MASC. "We look forward to continuing our partnership with Badger Region Volleyball to welcome athletes and their fans to compete, cheer and enjoy volleyball and activities in the indelible Madison."

The All-Star Championships started in the early 2000s as an elite-level event designed to showcase regional All-Star teams along with national training teams from USA Volleyball, the national governing body of volleyball in the United States, in multiple age divisions. Previously known as the High Performance Champion-

ships, the USA Volleyball All-Star Championships are now run by the Regional Volleyball Associations and it is endorsed by USA Volleyball as a "pipeline" event to the National Team Development and Olympic programs.

Badger Region has been a participant in this event since its beginning, capturing 15 medals, including most recently a bronze medal by the U13 girls team last July in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and a gold medal by the U17 boys and U17 girls teams in 2022 in Tulsa, Okla. The 2024 All-Star Volleyball Championships will be held in Des Moines, Iowa in mid-July. Information about the Badger Region Volleyball tryouts for the 2024 teams will be announced in January.





How is the Badger Region Board structured?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve four-year terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they

think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities).

The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.


