PROPER ATTIRE AND PROTOCOL

- Officials need to know and wear official uniform (outer jackets not allowed, unless the white cert ref or unbranded white jacket). If you are confused about what to wear please email sara at sara@ badgervolleyball.org

Other reminders:

- NO spandex pants

- Officials must wear USAV patch at all times when officiating

- Only a small ref bag comes to the court side, must include a rule book and have easy access. Do not bring duffel bags or any other large bags to the court. Ask the tournament director where you can safely leave your belongings.

- Refs ARE responsible to check in with tourney director or head official before going direct to court and before leaving at the end of the day.

- Officials MUST read the pre-read before coming to tourney in advance and are encouraged to print a copy and put in ref bag.

Do's and don'ts on social media

DO be aware that posts on social media are visible to the general public. Even if you limit access to your page to friends, it is likely that your post will be viewed by someone beyond the circle of people you intended to see it.

DO find out your association or league expectations regarding social media. Your association may not have hard and fast rules, but find out if it has an unofficial policy.

DO think twice before you post. If there is anything in your post that could be construed as a criticism of officials, of officials' decisions, or of schools, coaches or athletes...it is better left unsent.

DO assume that your post

will be seen by the two teams you will see in your next game and the teams you worked in your previous game as well as your partner(s) in those games.

DON'T post anything relating to the schools you have worked or will work. It calls your objectivity into question.

DON'T include anything in a post that makes reference to an upcoming assignment. If teams want to find out who is going to be working their game, they should do so through official channels, not your tweet.

DON'T post details about other people's regular season or playoff assignments. Don't use your page as a news service. DON'T use social media to criticize state or local association policies, assigning practices, etc. DON'T make posts regarding calls made by officials in other games, whatever the level. You and your buddies might debate the call you saw on TV, but debating the call on Facebook, Twitter or other forums and social media is a no-no.

DON'T "friend", "follow" or otherwise interact with student-athletes in any social media forum. Regardless of the intentions, it is risky and unwise for an official to communicate with student athletes, since it could call into question your objectivity or motives.

Set up your direct deposit

Did you know that if you work the Badger Region's marquee events that you can be paid with direct deposit through our accounting company? Yes. You can.

Independent contractors who work the Badger Region Championships, Qualifier, Power League and Dale Rohde Memorial can set up an account and get paid via direct deposit.

To set up an account through Bill.com, click here.

The system will ask you some questions so follow the prompts, and you will also be asked to confirm your contact information.

The monies worked while officiating, scoring or serving as a lead official, score monitor, etc., can then be deposited electronically. A paper check would not be sent. Through this system, deposits are made roughly three days after they are processed and approved.
