"By day I am a project manager so I have a keen eye for detail and seeing things through, which I think is important when helping to provide direction and guidance."

She graduated from the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse in 2015. She coached girls volleyball at La Crosse Logan High School for two years and coached at Brookfield Central High School from 2015 to 2021. She is currently a boys coach for Milwaukee Sting Volleyball Club.

Jablonowski brings a unique perspective to the top spot on the Badger Region Board of Directors.

Member named to U19 Beach training team

Sixteen athletes, including Middleton native Ambrose Engling, have been selected as part of the 2024 U19 Beach National Team Training Block #1.

Engling was the MVP of the WIAA boys high school state tournament and the state champion Middleton High School Cardinals. The former Badger Region High Performance All-Star is destined for Princeton University in the fall.

The players trained June 10-14 at Hermosa Beach, Calif., with trials taking place June 17-20. The first team, second team and alternates will be named post-trials with the top performing pair of each gender earning the right to represent the U.S. at the FIVB Beach U19 World Championship.

Ohio State indoor associate head coach Hudson Bates will coach the boys assisted by Beach NTDP assistant coach Laurel Weaver.

University of Texas beach assistant coach Angie Akers will coach the Girls U19 squad. UCLA beach assistant Kelly Reeves will assist Akers.

She is going to do fantastic as the board president and I look forward to our collaborations as Badger Region continues to be on the forefront in the volleyball community."

USAVAcademy easier to access

The ability to access ref-training modules, junior officiating tools, coaching education resources and much more just became easier.

To access the USA Volleyball Academy, where all learning

modules are stored, log in to your Sports Engine account.

On your landing page, you will find the USAV Academy "LAUNCH" button that will direct

vou to the learning platform.

If you manage your account in addition to other household accounts (son, daughter, etc.) you will be prompted right away to "Select a Profile" of who is asking for access to the Academy. Pick your profile and you are on your way.

Once in the Academy, you can use the tools on the left rail to access the following:

* Enrollments (current assigned/required courses) * Content Library (full, searchable databases)

* Certificates (Accomplished certifications)



* Live Sessions (Mostly used for live coaching webinars) * Help Desk Reminder: Only profiles with active, paid memberships will have access to

the USAV Academy. Trying to access the Academy as a parent of a player will not allow you to see ref-training videos. You will need to select the profile of the athlete to see items like Line Judge Training or Scorer Training.

AVCA to host 'First Serve' showcase

Top college teams head to Louisville to kick off season

LEXINGTON, KENTUCKY (June 3, 2024) — Four of the nation's top collegiate volleyball teams will open the 2024 women's season¬¬ at the AVCA First Serve Showcase on Aug. 27. The event features Kentucky, Louisville, Nebraska, and Wisconsin, and starts at 7 p.m. (ET) at Louisville's KFC Yum! Center.

"The AVCA is very excited to bring together four teams of this caliber to get the new season started," says AVCA CEO Dr.



Jaime Gordon. "AVCA First Serve offers another way to showcase the sport and continue the momentum from the record-setting 2023 season."

The first match of the night will feature Nebraska and Kentucky. The Huskers were the 2023 NCAA runner-up and they return four AVCA All-Americans, while the Wildcats, who won the national title in the spring of 2021, are led by three-time All-American setter Emma Grome.

Wisconsin then plays Louisville, in a battle of teams that have both made the NCAA semifinals two times in the last three years. The Badgers were national champions in the fall of 2021, and the Cardinals finished second in 2022. Each team returns three AVCA-All Americans from 2023.

With AVCA First Serve taking place in Louisville on Aug. 27, it means the 2024 season will both begin and end at the KFC Yum! Center, which is also the site of the 2024 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship Dec. 19 and 22. AVCA First Serve matches will be broadcast on ESPN2.

AVCA First Serve marks the dawn of a new era for the association's preseason event. The AVCA sponsored similar early season events from 1995 to 2011 and in 2014 and is able to restart this tradition based on its existing exemption through the NCAA for such competitions.

Tickets are on sale now.

Membership options as we approach the 24-25 season

With June right around the corner we thought we would focus on membership options as the summer tryout period draws closer. The most important thing we want to clarify is that the current (2023-2024) membership season does not end until August 31, 2024; the 2024-2025 membership season does not begin until September 1, 2024 (with tryout memberships being the one exception). See below for a few examples of memberships that can be used/purchased for the summer tryout period.

Please send any questions from returning or prospective members to membership@ badgervolleyball.org before purchasing the wrong membership type. Memberships are non-refundable and a refund waiver acknowledging such is agreed upon at the time of purchase.

An athlete/coach who has a



2023-2024 Badger Junior Player Membership or 2023-2024 Adult Coach of Juniors Membership: No action needed prior to tryouts; their membership is valid through August 31, 2024.

They may begin purchasing 2024-2025 Full memberships (\$55) on July 1 (not valid until Sept 1), which will allow them to accept a club assignment request in Sports Engine.

A NEW athlete looking to participate in summer tune-ups & tryouts: We would recommend the 2023-2024 Badger Summer Junior Player Membership (\$20). This membership covers all participation (with the exception of competition) until 8/31/24. The one negative to this is that since it is a 2023-2024 membership, it IS NOT upgradeable to a 2024-2025 membership. They can purchase the 2024-2025 Badger Junior Player membership (\$55) anytime after receiving an offer in order to accept their club assignment

A new coach looking to participate in tune-ups & tryouts: We recommend using the 23-24 Badger Summer Adult Coach of Juniors Membership (\$20). They will need to complete a background screen, SafeSport, and IMPACT prior to participation. PLEASE NOTE: if SafeSport is completed prior to August 1, 2024, it will need to be taken again after August 1, 2024 in order to be applied to a 2024-2025 Badger Adult Coach of Juniors membership (\$55, available July 1; valid Sept 1)

An athlete, without current membership, looking to register for Tryouts only: We recommend they purchase a 24-25 Badger Tryout – July through Dec membership (\$10); available for purchase starting June 3, valid beginning July 1.

Athletes or Coaches not participating in the summer tryout period, but participating in the traditional fall tryout period: Purchase any 2024-2025 membership options beginning July 1 (valid on Sept 1).





Boys Junior Nationals to remain four days in 2025

USA Volleyball has announced that it will continue the four-day competition format for the 2025 Boys Junior National Championship (BJNC) on July 3-6 at the Minneapolis Convention Center in Minneapolis, Minn.

The BJNC schedule will allow all ages and divisions (Open, USA, American and Club) to be contested over the same four-day period.

USAV will continue to enhance

the event in 2025 by including a National Team Development Program (NTDP) Experience on July 2, the day before BJNC competition begins.

Highlights of the NTDP experience include:

* A one-day development opportunity for invited athletes that will showcase the training methods used by U.S. national teams and at NTDP Training Series events. Athletes will be nominated by club directors participating at BJNCs and USA Volleyball Regions.

Combining on-court competition with an off-court classroom session emphasizing the best practices for success in international volleyball and in alignment with the five pillars of the USA Volleyball Development Model – Team, Heart, Body, Mind, Craft * Club coaches, directors and parents will be welcome to attend and observe the event that will incorporate training enhancement resources from the NTDP Academy (a free benefit for USA Volleyball members) and Education Services.

* Minneapolis is a great volleyball city and USA Volleyball looks forward to welcoming all the teams to Minneapolis in July 2025.

Region offers outdoor net rentals

The Badger Region invested in 12 outdoor nets and is offering rental of those nets for Badger Region clubs and members to bolster beach or grass programming in their organization.

If you or your club needs nets that might be used for an outdoor tournament, clinic or social gathering, contact Program Director Brian Sharkey at brian@ badgervolleyball.org or call/text him at 414-313-9055.

- All of the Park N Sun net systems include:
- Two poles
- Net
- Rope tiedowns
- Metal stakes
- Court lines with stakes

Renters would be responsible for all set-up, takedown and transportation (to and from the Badger Region office) of the outdoor nets rented from the Badger Region Volleyball Association. (Mallets/hammers to anchor stakes are not included)

- Nets will be rented at the following rates:
- 1-4 nets: \$25/weekend/net

- 5-8 nets: \$20/weekend/net
- 9-12 nets: \$15/weekend/net

If you or club agrees to rent three or more times throughout the summer, an additional 20 percent will be taken off your rental rate. Individuals must be a member in good standing with of the Badger Region in order to rent the outdoor nets.

Payment in full must be made with credit card prior to rental. An electronic invoice will be sent in advance of the pick-up date.

All materials must be returned to the Badger Region office in the condition in which they were rented to the club or individual. Damaged net systems will result in a fine of \$250 to the credit card on file.

Please schedule rental of nets at least three weeks in advance of the date needed for the net systems.

Are your team's jerseys compliant?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association wants to make sure your team's jerseys are compliant with all rule sets and changes that have gone into effect.

To do so, the Region's Ref Chair is encouraging club directors or coaches to send images if there is any concern that numbers are not contrasting enough with the dominant color of the jersey or if a jersey is not contrasting for libero purposes.

The photos of the jerseys should not be of any junior athlete in uniform.

Reminder: All numbers must clearly contrast with the color of the jersey, regardless of the color of the outline of the number.

If your team plans to attend a USA Volleyball Boys or Girls Qualifier or National Championship, the Region can also help direct you as to the proper channels you must go through to get jersey waivers.

Board approves changes to tryouts

Region clubs allowed to offer a summer tryout

The Badger Region Board of Directors met Nov. 20, and voted to allow an additional tryout and commitment period to take place in the summer starting with the 2024-25 club volleyball season while maintaining the October and November tryout and commitment periods that are currently in place.

The following motion was approved by the Board 11-1 and will be effective July 1, 2024.

The Badger Region will allow clubs to open tryouts to all ages and gender of athletes on the second Saturday after the conclusion of the final day of the USA Volleyball Girls Junior National Championships (GJNC) or Boys Junior National Championships (BJNC) (whichever is later). All tryouts must be completed by 11:59 p.m. CT the Sunday before the start of the WIAA season. If an athlete receives an offer from a club, it must be honored until 7 p.m. CT Aug. 1. Any offer made after that time is at the discretion of the club.

Summer tryouts must be concluded once high school season begins. If a club holds a tryout during the regular fall tryout period, they may do so the first Saturday in October for athletes 14-and-younger, or the Saturday after the conclusion of the WIAA state volleyball tournament (15-and-older). Clubs must honor their offers until the Monday after the tryout period at 7 p.m. Any offers made after 7 p.m. are at the discretion of the club.

Clubs can offer a retention offer to those athletes who played for their club that season for the following club season to athletes starting on July 1 through seven days after the final day of the GJNC or BJNC (whichever is later).

Details

The second Saturday after the last day of the GJNC and BJNC would allow a minimum of at least eight days for an athlete to recover from the end of their season. It will also allow some time for athletes and families to consider pos-



sible retention offers they may have received, and mirrors tryout policies from neighboring regions.

The policy allows clubs to host tryouts for all ages and genders during the summer

tryout period while still retaining the fall tryout periods. Clubs may choose to host tryouts during any or all of the available periods. The updated policy does not mandate that a club hold tryouts during the summer tryout period; this is up the discretion of each individual club.

The Aug. 1 commitment date allows a longer tryout period and will allow athletes to attend multiple tryouts possibly over two weekends. This gives athletes and families to try out at multiple locations and not have to race from club to club on just one day of tryouts. The Aug. 1 deadline gives clubs and athletes two weeks before the high school season starts.

Moving the retention period to July 1 through seven days after the final day of the GJNC or BJNC allows clubs who choose not to participate in the summer tryout period to retain athletes. The summer tryout period and summer retention appeal to athletes who want to know what club they will train with and compete with after their high school or middle school seasons.

If a club chooses to host a tryout in the summer period, they can then advertise for

available team openings for the fall tryout periods. Allowing a summer tryout gives clubs additional planning time to organize their resources to prepare for the upcoming club volleyball season.

Timeline

These policies will go into effect for the 2024-25 season, with the applicable dates below for the coming season

1. Retention will open July 1, 2024, for the 2024-25 season the last day of the 2024 GJNC / BJNC will be July 11.

2. The last day a retention offer can be signed will be July 18.

3. The first allowed dates for tryouts will be July 20

4. The first commitment date will be Aug. 1. Any offers made after this date are at the discretion of the club.

5. The last allowed date of summer tryouts will be Aug. 18.

6. WIAA (high school) season starts Aug. 19 7. Fall tryouts can start Oct. 5 for 14-and-un-


der (Commitment date: Oct.7)

8. Fall tryouts can start Nov. 16 for 15-and-older (Commitment date: Nov. 18)

More details about how official commitments will be made and other logistical adjustments will be published once they are finalized.

The Badger Region appreciates all of the time spent by the tryout committee, board members, club directors and others during this several year process. Numerous surveys of families and clubs, club director listening sessions and almost two years of planning went into the decision made by the Board of Directors.

Region to host 2025 All-Star event

Madison chosen for elite tournament

The Badger Region Volleyball Association and the Madison Area Sports Commission (MASC) are proud to announce that Madison and the Alliant Energy Center have been selected to host the 2025 USA Volleyball All-Star Championships. The event will feature All-Star teams from across the country composed of boys and girls players, ages 13-19, as well as officials from around the nation.

Madison was selected from various sites around the country by the participating programs. It will be the first time a Wisconsin city has hosted this prestigious event since 2010, when it was held in Wisconsin Dells.

Each participating region sends experienced and up-and-coming officials to work the event and be mentored by world-class officials to gain experience officiating high-level volleyball and making important connections to further

"Hosting this prestigious tournament in Madison -- one of the epicenters of volleyball has long been a goal of ours," said Jamie Patrick, VP of MASC. "We look forward to continuing our partnership with Badger Region Volleyball to welcome athletes and their fans to compete, cheer and enjoy volleyball and activities in the indelible Madison."

The All-Star Championships started in the early 2000s as an elite-level event designed to showcase regional All-Star teams along with national training teams from USA Volleyball, the national governing body of volleyball in the United States, in multiple age divisions. Previously known as the High Performance Championships, the USA Volleyball All-Star Championships are now run by the Regional Volleyball Associations and it is endorsed by USA Volleyball as a "pipeline" event to the National Team Development and Olympic programs.

Badger Region has been a participant in this event since its beginning, capturing 15 medals, including most recently a bronze medal by the U13 girls team last July in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and a gold medal by the U17 boys and U17 girls teams in 2022 in Tulsa, Okla. The 2024 All-Star Volleyball Championships will be held in Des Moines, Iowa in mid-July. Information about the Badger Region Volleyball tryouts for the 2024 teams will be announced in January.



How is the Badger Region Board structured?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve fourvear terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they


think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities).

The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:


