# Coaches, players dive in to training

Thirty new or inexperienced coaches joined 30 young athletes at the Badger Region's player/coach clinic on Aug. 24 at the New Berlin SportsPlex.

During the two-hour training, adults spent an hour working with lead trainers Brian Sharkey and Scott Spiess on developing a training philosophy, building a practice plan and working on rotations.

During the first hour, clinicians from the Milwaukee Dive and Milwaukee Gold semi-professional men's volleyball team who compete in the Volleyball League of America (VLA) spent time doing skills drills with the young athletes.

After the first hour, the two groups of adults and youths joined forces to focus on wash drills and other 6 vs. 6 drills to help prepare coaches and athletes for competition.

# Tryouts on the horizon

Now that the high school season has begun, tryouts in the Badger Region are on hold (for now).

Tryouts and the opportunity to accept an offer to a club ended at 11:59 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 18 so as to not conflict with the start of the high school season which began Monday, Aug. 19.

Next up for tryouts: Athletes 14-and-under can have tryouts starting on Oct. 5. Any athlete who receives an offer from a club on Oct. 5 or 6 has until 7 p.m. Oct. 7 to commit to the club before the club has the right to go to the next person on its waiting list.

Athletes 15-and-older will be able to try out for clubs in the Badger Region on Nov. 16 (the weekend after the conclusion of the WIAA state tournament). The first commitment date is 7 p.m. Nov. 18 for athletes who receive an offer on Nov. 16 or 17.

#### Next year's tryouts

Looking ahead to the following season: Retention will take place starting July 1 and go through July 13 (one week after the final day of nationals).

Next year, summer tryouts can take place starting July 19, 2025. The first commitment date is Aug. 1 for the 2025-26 season. Tryouts and offer acceptances can go up to 11:59 p.m. Aug. 17, the day prior to the 2025 high school season.

Clubs do not have to have summer tryouts. Contact your club about specific dates/plans.

# 'Second Chance' tryouts taking place Oct. 10, Nov. 20

The Badger Region will host its annual "Second Chance" tryouts on two dates this coming fall.

All tryouts will take place after the fall tryout period opens at an athlete's respective age level.

The first will take place from 6 to 8 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 10, at the New Berlin SportsPlex, 2900 S. 163rd St., for female athletes who are 14-and-under.

Any athlete 15-and-older can join

the Region for a Second Chance tryout from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 20, at the OAW Indoor Sports Complex located at 5330 S. Racine Ave.

At the Second Chance tryouts, the Badger Region, with the help of athletes from Milwaukee Gold and Milwaukee Dive, will run athletes through a clinic designed to help them improve their skills and showcase their talents to club directors who will be in attendance.

Club directors from Milwaukee area clubs who are still looking for athletes will be allowed to make offers to athletes via email or phone calls after the conclusion of the Second Chance tryout.

In years past, the Second Chance tryout has average 50-60 athletes participating in the tryout with 10-12 clubs in attendance. Most athletes who attend the tryout receive an

offer by the end of the week.

Registration for the Second Chance tryouts will open on Oct. 6 and Nov. 17, respectively.

Athletes looking for a club will also be allowed to put their name on the Badger Region website's list of Athletes Seeking Clubs after Oct. 5, too. Check out those lists, here.

Four of college volleyball's premier programs competed in the inaugural Women's College Volleyball Showcase from Sept. 1-2 at Fiserv Forum, home of the Milwaukee Bucks.

Minnesota, Stanford, Texas and Wisconsin participated over Labor Day weekend, with all four matches airing nationally. Two of the matches were featured on FOX, with the other two on FS1. Below are the results for the 2024 Women's College Volleyball Showcase:

Wisconsin, Stanford and Texas all made last season's national quarterfinals as three of the final eight teams standing.

Fiserv Forum is no stranger to hosting college volleyball matches. Last September, Wisconsin played Marquette in the NBA arena, drawing 17,037 fans — ranking 14th on the list of highest-attended women's college volleyball matches, heading into 2024. It was the highest-attended women's sporting event in Wisconsin.

# Are your program's jerseys compliant?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association wants to make sure your team's jerseys are compliant with all rule sets and changes that have gone into effect.

To do so, the Region's Ref Chair is encouraging club directors or coaches to send images if there is any concern that numbers are not contrasting enough with the dominant color of the jersey or if a jersey is not contrasting for libero purposes.

The photos of the jerseys should not be of any junior ath-

lete in uniform.

Reminder: All numbers must clearly contrast with the color of the jersey, regardless of the color of the outline of the number.

If your team plans to attend a USA Volleyball Boys or Girls Qualifier or National Championship, the Region can also help direct you as to the proper channels you must go through to get jersey waivers.

#### Things to know about SafeSport

Are you (or your junior athlete/coach) turning 18 (or older) during the upcoming club volleyball season?

Then consider this your reminder that you must take your SafeSport training to be able to fully participate in the 2024-25 season.

Parents, this means if your son or daughter turns 18 BEFORE Sept. 1, 2025, then he or she MUST purchase the membership that requires SafeSport training to be eligible for the season.

"But my daughter's season ends before she turns 18?" That's a common reaction to this requirements, but we can explain:

1. The USA Volleyball season goes through Aug. 31, 2025.

- 2. There are LOTS of club that train and compete into July that an athlete might be part of now or get added on to later.
- 3. There are lots of summer camps and clinic that would require the training
- 4. There are lots of beach tournaments and beach clubs that require the 18s member + SafeSport to be a part of their club
- 5. Lots of athletes ends of jumping on to rosters to help coach a younger team.

All of these reasons (among others) are why USA Volleyball and the United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee require SafeSport to be a part of the organization for the upcoming season.

<sup>3</sup> Male Only - Players who were born on or after July 1, 2010, OR players who were born on or after July 1, 2009 (15 years or younger) who shall neither have completed nor are in a grade higher than the eighth (8<sup>th</sup>) grade during the current academic year are eligible to play in the 14 & Under division. This exception is based on the net height difference of 7'4 1/8" to 7'11 5/8" between the 14 and Under Division to the 15 and Under Division.

<sup>4</sup>Male Only - Players who were born on or after July 1, 2010 (14 years or younger) who shall neither have completed nor are in a grade higher than the seventh grade (7th) during the current academic year are eligible for a Region approved waiver to compete in the boys 13's age group.

Male Only — Players who were born on or after July 1, 2011 (13 years or younger) who shall neither have completed nor are in a grade higher than the sixth grade (6th) during the current academic year are eligible for a Region approved waiver to compete in the boys 12's age group.

The 2023-24 marks the eighth year of the "Enthusiastic. Supportive. Positive." program that highlights volleyball enthusiasts, specifically fans in the stands.

Last season, tournament directors throughout the Region distributed close to 250 wristbands at events and tournaments, and we're looking to hand out hundreds more.

Then, at the Badger Region Championships in March, anyone (adults/spectators only) who was awarded a wristband throughout the year, will be eligible to



win Badger Region gear such as T-shirts, water bottles, mini volleyballs and other cool swag.

# Region to host 2025 All-Star event

# Madison chosen for elite tournament

The Badger Region Volleyball Association and the Madison Area Sports Commission (MASC) are proud to announce that Madison and the Alliant Energy Center have been selected to host the 2025 USA Volleyball All-Star Championships. The event will feature All-Star teams from across the country composed of boys and girls players, ages 13-19, as well as officials from around the nation.

Madison was selected from various sites around the country by the participating programs. It will be the first time a Wisconsin city has hosted this prestigious event since 2010, when it was held in Wisconsin Dells.

"We are very proud to be hosting this event in Madison, in partnership with the Madison Area Sports Commission," said Badger Region Volleyball Executive Director and Commissioner Jennifer Armson-Dyer. "Wisconsin is a hotbed of volleyball at all levels, and to be able to bring this event to our local community is very rewarding. The event will take place in late July 2025 at the Alliant Energy Center and will feature four days of competition across nine divisions of both boys and girls volleyball ages 13-19. More than 100 participating teams will come from the 40 regions of USA Volleyball along with international teams. In the past, teams from Canada, Puerto Rico, Australia and New Zealand have attended the event.

Not only will players, coaches and spectators travel from around the nation to Madison, but officials will as well. Each participating region sends experienced and up-and-coming officials to work the event and be mentored by world-class officials to gain experience officiating high-level volleyball and making important connections to further

"Hosting this prestigious tournament in Madison -- one of the epicenters of volleyball has long been a goal of ours," said Jamie Patrick, VP of MASC. The All-Star Championships started in the early 2000s as an elite-level event designed to showcase regional All-Star teams along with national training teams from USA Volleyball, the national governing body of volleyball in the United States, in multiple age divisions. Previously known as the High Performance Champion-

ships, the USA Volleyball All-Star Championships are now run by the Regional Volleyball Associations and it is endorsed by USA Volleyball as a "pipeline" event to the National Team Development and Olympic programs.

Badger Region has been a participant in this event since its beginning, capturing 15 medals, including most recently a bronze medal by the U13 girls team last July in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and a gold medal by the U17 boys and U17 girls teams in 2022 in Tulsa, Okla. The 2024 All-Star Volleyball Championships will be held in Des Moines, Iowa in mid-July. Information about the Badger Region Volleyball tryouts for the 2024 teams will be announced in January.

### How is the Badger Region Board structured?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve four-year terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities).

The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.


