What is the importance of the Badger Region?

What is the Badger Region? If you were to compare it to the structure of the U.S. government, USA Volleyball operates at a federal level and the Regions would operate at the state level. Regions have to follow the lead of USA Volleyball on lots of policies, but can set up the infrastructure at the local level that is best for each part of the country.

When someone has a concern, they contact their Region office.

If there are athletes that want to play and just compete at the local level, the Region can direct them to those resources. If they want to travel the country and compete on the national stage, Regions can point athletes and coaches to those types of opportunities, too.

Regional Volleyball Associations, like the Badger Region, are the grassroots, localized, customer-support hubs throughout the country. USA Volleyball sets the standards, structure and the framework that the 40 Regions of USA Volleyball operate within.

USA Volleyball is also the only entity in the United States that can send a team to the Olympics, NORCECA or other FIVB Championship Events.

The Regions work very closely with the clubs because the clubs are working with athletes, coaches and officials in the community. Regions are on the ground level where that 10-year-old gets his first serve over the net, or where an official advances to her next level or where a coach receives mentoring that helps them guide future ballers.

USA Volleyball names John Speraw as new president and CEO

USA Volleyball has announced that it has hired John Speraw to serve as its president and Chief Executive Officer, starting on Oct. 1. Prior to becoming the eighth CEO of USA

Volleyball, Speraw has served as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team since 2013 and has been part of the team's leadership for almost two decades.

"My journey with USA Volleyball began in 1997 as an assistant coach for the World University Games team," Speraw said. "Reflect-

ing on the teams, players, staff and experiences over the years, I am filled with immense gratitude. To now be entrusted with the opportunity to lead USA Volleyball as president and CEO is both a profound honor and deeply humbling.

"This journey has deepened my passion for this organization-representing our country, advancing the sport, and elevating the experience for everyone involved. I am sincerely grateful to the USA Volleyball Board of Directors for this honor and responsibility. I am ready to lead. I am ready to serve."

Speraw's coaching and leadership roles within USA Volleyball bring a unique blend of executive vision, recognition of the diverse and complex ecosystem of the sport and expertise in the international scene.

His strategic vision of the sport's evolution is critically important as USA Volleyball prepares for the 2028 Olympic and Paralympics in Los Angeles and the 2032 Games in Brisbane, Australia.

Speraw is also the founder of First Point Volleyball, an organization dedicated to supporting the growth of boys' and men's volleyball across

the country. "The search group composed of key USA Volleyball Board members concluded that John's overall sport acumen, demeanor, energy, leadership skills and vision for the future of the sport were clearly aligned with the Board's expectations for the next generation of USA Volleyball," said USA Volleyball Board of Directors Chair Dave Gentile

"Along with the full Board and staff, I look forward to working closely with John over the next several years as he prepares the organization for LA28 and beyond. We are also confident that John's leadership will always have the mission and role of USA Volleyball as the National Governing Body of the sport of volleyball at the forefront of all we do."

Besides coaching the U.S. Men's Team, Speraw has been the head men's volleyball coach at UCLA since 2012 and guided the Bruins to the NCAA Division I-II National Championship in 2023 and 2024.

Results are made available to coaches in weekly emails and are available on the Wis-Sports.net website for review prior to voting.

For the 2024 season, 68 programs in Wisconsin are eligible for post-season competition in the WIAA tournament. An additional four programs offer boys volleyball but are not sanctioned yet as full varsity sport at their school.

'Second Chance' tryouts taking place Oct. 10, Nov. 20

The Badger Region will host its annual "Second Chance" tryouts on two dates this coming fall.

All tryouts will take place after the fall tryout period opens at an athlete's respective age level.

The first will take place from 6 to 8 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 10, at the New Berlin SportsPlex, 2900 S. 163rd St., for female athletes who are 14-and-under.

Any athlete 15-and-older can join

the Region for a Second Chance tryout from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 20, at the OAW Indoor Sports Complex located at 5330 S. Racine Ave.

At the Second Chance tryouts, the Badger Region, with the help of athletes from Milwaukee Gold and Milwaukee Dive, will run athletes through a clinic designed to help them improve their skills and showcase their talents to club directors who will be in attendance.

Club directors from Milwaukee area clubs who are still looking for athletes will be allowed to make offers to athletes via email or phone calls after the conclusion of the Second Chance tryout.

In years past, the Second Chance tryout has average 50-60 athletes participating in the tryout with 10-12 clubs in attendance. Most athletes who attend the tryout receive an offer by the end of the week. Registration for the Second Chance tryouts will open on Oct. 6 and Nov. 17, respectively.

Athletes looking for a club will also be allowed to put their name on the Badger Region website's list of Athletes Seeking Clubs after Oct. 5, too. <u>Check out those lists, here.</u>

Tryouts on the horizon

By now, most people should know that U14 tryouts can start this Saturday, Oct. 5.

Athletes who receive an offer Oct. 5-7 have until 7 p.m. Oct. 7 to get back to their club or the club has the right to go to the next person on the waiting list for that spot.

Athletes 15-and-older will be able to try out for clubs in the Badger Region on Nov. 16 (the weekend after the conclusion of the WIAA state tournament). The first commitment date is 7 p.m. Nov. 18 for athletes who receive an offer on Nov. 16 or 17.

Next year's tryouts

Looking ahead to the following season: Retention will take place starting July 1 and go through July 13 (one week after the final day of nationals).

Next year, summer tryouts can take place starting July 19, 2025. The first commitment date is Aug. 1 for the 2025-26 season. Tryouts and offer acceptances can go up to 11:59 p.m. Aug. 17, the day prior to the 2025 high school season.

Clubs do not have to have summer tryouts. Contact your club about specific dates/plans.

Are your program's jerseys compliant?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association wants to make sure your team's jerseys are compliant with all rule sets and changes that have gone into effect.

To do so, the Region's Ref Chair is encouraging club directors or coaches to send images if there is any concern that numbers are not contrasting enough with the dominant color of the jersey or if a jersey is not contrasting for libero purposes. The photos of the jerseys should not be of any junior athlete in uniform.

Reminder: All numbers must clearly contrast with the color of the jersey, regardless of the color of the outline of the number. If your team plans to attend a USA Volleyball Boys or Girls Qualifier or National Championship, the Region can also help direct you as to the proper channels you must go through to get jersey waivers.

Region to host 2025 All-Star event

Madison chosen for elite tournament

The Badger Region Volleyball Association and the Madison Area Sports Commission (MASC) are proud to announce that Madison and the Alliant Energy Center have been selected to host the 2025 USA Volleyball All-Star Championships. The event will feature All-Star teams from across the country composed of boys and girls players, ages 13-19, as well as officials from around the nation.

Madison was selected from various sites around the country by the participating programs. It will be the first time a Wisconsin city has hosted this prestigious event since 2010, when it was held in Wisconsin Dells.

"We are very proud to be hosting this event in Madison, in partnership with the Madison Area Sports Commission," said Badger Region Volleyball Executive Director and Commissioner Jennifer Armson-Dyer. "Wisconsin is a hotbed of volleyball at all levels, and to be able to bring this event to our local community is very rewarding. We're looking forward to showing the juniors volleyball community what Madison is about."

The event will take place in late July 2025 at the Alliant Energy Center and will feature four days of competition across nine divisions of both boys and girls volleyball ages 13-19. More than 100 participating teams will come from the 40 regions of USA Volleyball along with international teams. In the past, teams from Canada, Puerto Rico, Australia and New Zealand have attended the event.

Not only will players, coaches and spectators travel from around the nation to Madison, but officials will as well. Each participating region sends experienced and up-and-coming officials to work the event and be mentored by world-class officials to gain experience officiating high-level volleyball and making important connections to further

their careers.

"Hosting this prestigious tournament in Madison -- one of the epicenters of volleyball has long been a goal of ours," said Jamie Patrick, VP of MASC. "We look forward to continuing our partnership with Badger Region Volleyball to welcome athletes and their fans to compete, cheer and enjoy volleyball and activities in the indelible Madison."

The All-Star Championships started in the early 2000s as an elite-level event designed to showcase regional All-Star teams along with national training teams from USA Volleyball, the national governing body of volleyball in the United States, in multiple age divisions. Previously known as the High Performance Championships, the USA Volleyball All-Star Championships are now run by the Regional Volleyball Associations and it is endorsed by USA Volleyball as a "pipeline" event to the National Team Development and Olympic programs.

Badger Region has been a participant in this event since its beginning, capturing 15 medals, including most recently a bronze medal by the U13 girls team last July in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and a gold medal by the U17 boys and U17 girls teams in 2022 in Tulsa, Okla. The 2024 All-Star Volleyball Championships will be held in Des Moines, Iowa in mid-July. Information about the Badger Region Volleyball tryouts for the 2024 teams will be announced in January.

How is the Badger Region Board structured?


The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve fouryear terms.


Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities). The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:
