Region to host coaching event at WIAA tourney

Heading to Green Bay for the WIAA Boys and Girls State Volleyball Tournament?

Then make sure to visit the Coaches Education and Networking sessions planned from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 7, in the Resch Expo Center located adjacent to the site of the state volleyball championship tournament.

Some of the scheduled speakers and attendees include Ryan Theis (Marquette University women's volleyball head coach), BJ Bryant (St. Norbert College men's and women's head coach) and Jenny Johnson (Director of Education at USA Volleyball).

"When we started thinking about re-shaping coaches education for the upcoming year/season, we knew we wanted to get back to more in-person offerings and thought about how and where we might attract a large group of coaches at one time," said Badger Region Director of Education Scott Spiess. "Having a presence at the WIAA state tournament makes sense for a lot of reasons. It's the celebration of a season where state champions are crowned, but also an event well attended by aspiring coaches, veteran coaches and everyone in-between; many high school coaches also coach club volleyball or may be thinking about it. Much like the officials shortage, we can't have teams and state champions without quality coaching. The Badger Region wants to let ALL volleyball coaches know that we can be a resource for them and help connect them with many more (USAV, AOC, AVCA to name a few)."

"We felt it was important to bring coaching education and information to the WIAA Boys and Girls State Tournament to meet people where they're at and show them that we want to be a partner to promote and further volleyball in the state of Wisconsin," said Badger Region Executive Director Jennifer Armson-Dyer. "We're all in it for the same reason - to improve the game and also give the student-athletes the best possible experience. We also wanted to bring in some big names to speak to give coaches a wide range of information that would fit where they are at and the information they would want to know. We hope everyone stops by to say hi, meet our staff and our panel and speak with Dr. Jenny Johnson from USA Volleyball, who is an incredible person and resource in coaching education."

There is no fee to attend the networking event or Q&A sessions. Food will be served throughout the day.

Lunch & Learn focuses on sportsmanship

Three years ago, the Badger Region partnered with Won80, an organization dedicated to sportsmanship and the role it plays in athletics and character development. And the positive feedback we have gotten from this partnership have flowed in.

As a benefit to members (clubs, parents, fans, officials and athletes), the Badger Region will work to coordinate Won80 with clubs who are interested in receiving a free sportsmanship presentation from founder Mark Horbinski, a longtime teacher, coach and official in Wisconsin for over 30 years.

Horbinski's grassroots movement called Won80 is on a mission to lead a return to sportsmanship through awareness, education and inspiration. His presentations encourage participants to focus on their own behaviors and action that will in turn allow everyone to positively impact teammates, teams and communities alike.

Won80's sportsmanship summits (many of which are about 60 minutes in length) are hands-on, high energy and engaging. They also contain relevant topics that coincide



with thought-provoking and empowering messages. Horbinski also is able to work with clubs to collaborate and customize his presentations for specifics groups.

To help spread the message of positive sportsmanship, Mark joined staff members Brian Sharkey and Sara Voigt last week in a lunch & learn that were broken down into the following topics:

1. Introduction: What are we seeing with sportsmanship 2. Handling poor sportsmanship between two athletes (on

different teams/across the net) 3. Managing poor sportsman-

ship within one's own team 4. <u>Keeping parent behavior in</u> check

out the 5-10 minute video edited from the full Lunch & Learn discus-

Coaching application now open for All-Star program

The Badger Region is seeking coaches for positions within the High Performance All-Star program for the 2025 season.

To apply for a coaching position, click here.

Applications are due by Friday, Dec. 20.

Coaches are required to attend their respective age group/gender's tryout, participate in the one-day training sessions, work the overnight camp and coach at the 2025 USA All-Star Championships in Madison this summer.

Coaching applications are required for any individual interested in working at a:

- * Training date
- * Overnight camp
- * All-Star Tournament

All of the above listed are paid opportunities. All coaches are



independent contractors who must sign an independent contractor agreement and agree to the Region's All-Star Expectations and Philosophies.

If you are interested in volunteering at a tryout for the Badger Region High Performance All-Star program, please email brian@badgervolleyball.org.

All levels of coaches are encouraged to apply. That includes college coaches, high school coaches and club coaches. The only requirements are that the individual has a membership, SafeSport, background screening and IMPACT certification.

Coaches not selected for camp or travel team obligations will still benefit from networking and observation opportunities with experienced HP All-Star coaches in the Badger Region.

The potential schedule for this year's All-Star program is as follows:

* Feb. 28 (possible girls tryouts at the Baird Center in Milwaukee prior to the Badger Region Girls Qualifier)

* March 21 (possible boys tryouts at the Baird Center in Milwaukee prior to the Dale Rohde Memorial)

* One-day training sessions (two weekend dates in April or May at sites to be announced)

* Overnight camp will fall two days between July 13-18 at a college or university to be named soon.

* July 23: Report/practice date in Madison

* July 24-27: Competition in Madison.

In addition to a coaching salary, staff will receive per diem for food, a Badger backpack, free hotel and lots of Badger Region apparel and swag items.

⁴Male Only - Players who were born on or after July 1, 2010 (14 years or younger) who shall neither have completed nor are in a grade higher than the seventh grade (7th) during the current academic year are eligible for a Region approved waiver to compete in the boys 13's age group.

⁵Male Only –Players who were born on or after July 1, 2011 (13 years or younger) who shall neither have completed nor are in a grade higher than the sixth grade (6th) during the current academic year are eligible for a Region approved waiver to compete in the boys 12's age group.

'Second Chance' tryouts Nov. 20

The Badger Region will host its 15-and-older "Second Chance" tryouts from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 20, at the OAW Indoor Sports Complex located at 5330 S. Racine Ave.

At the Second Chance tryouts, the Badger Region, with the help of athletes from Milwaukee Gold and Milwaukee Dive, will run athletes through a clinic designed to help them improve their skills and showcase their talents to club directors who will be in attendance.

Club directors from Milwaukee area clubs who are still looking for athletes will be allowed to make offers to athletes via email or phone calls after the conclusion of the Second Chance tryout.

In years past, the Second Chance tryout has average 50-60 athletes participating in the tryout with 10-12 clubs in attendance. Most athletes who attend the tryout receive an offer by the end of the week.

Registration for the Second Chance tryouts will open Nov. 17.

Tryouts ahead

Athletes 15-and-older will be able to try out for clubs in the Badger Region on Nov. 16 (the weekend after the conclusion of the WIAA state tournament). The first commitment date is 7 p.m. Nov. 18 for athletes who receive an offer on Nov. 16 or 17.

Next year's tryouts

Looking ahead to the following season: Retention will take place starting July 1 and go through July 13 (one week after the final day of nationals).

Next year, summer tryouts can take place starting July 19, 2025. The first commitment date is Aug. 1 for the 2025-26 season. Tryouts and offer acceptances can go up to 11:59 p.m. Aug. 17, the day prior to the 2025 high school season.

Clubs do not have to have summer tryouts. Contact your club about specific dates/plans.

Hortonville benefits from boys grant

We have completed our boys volleyball pilot program at Hortonville High School. We had 20 students participate with all 20 starting and ending the season. The team was open to all students grades 9-12 and we played primarily a JV/Frosh schedule. The program and the district appreciates the support for our program here.

With the grant, the program was able to purchase uniforms, volleyballs, and carts. We had tremendous community support and our middle schools are now working to create programs at that level. With the high number of underclassmen (17/20) that participated and with support from the other FVA schools, Horton-ville is planning to offer a full program next year with a Varsity and JV program and if numbers are greater, a freshmen team too.

Karch Kiraly to lead U.S. Men's National Team

USA Volleyball has announced that Karch Kiraly will transition to head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2028 Olympic & Paralympic Quadrennial.

Kiraly transfers to the post with the current coach, John Speraw, having been named USA Volleyball's president and CEO on October 1. Speraw served for 12 years as the Men's National



Team head coach. "I am thrilled that Team USA's greatest winner will be moving

from the U.S. Women's Team to lead the U.S. Men into LA 2028," Speraw said. "I have complete and total trust in Karch's process. He has a relentless work ethic, brilliant intellect and is a selfless teacher."

Kiraly transfers to the U.S. Men's National Team from his role as head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team where he has served since September 2012. Most recently, he led the U.S. Women to the silver medal at the 2024 Paris Olympic Games. In 2021, he helped the U.S. Women win their first Olympic gold medal in Tokyo. He also coached the team to an Olympic bronze medal in Rio 2016 and to its first World Championship win in 2014.

"Chances to collaborate with some of the best people and players on the planet – and to represent our country while striving for incredibly difficult goals like Olympic gold medals – are precious beyond words," Kiraly said. "For one-quarter of my life, I've poured everything I have into the U.S. Women's Team; first as an assistant, then as head coach. Now, it's time for new adventures and new challenges."

The U.S. Women have won three Volleyball Nations League trophies (2018, '19 and '21) and the 2015 Grand Prix under Kiraly, who compiled a 327-81 record in his 12 years as head coach. Prior to becoming the head coach, he served as an assistant coach for four years under Hugh McCutcheon and helped the U.S. Women win the 2012 Olympic silver medal.

Kiraly takes over a U.S. Men's Team that won the bronze medal at the 2024 Paris Olympic Games and is ranked No. 3 in the world.

"I am thrilled beyond words at the opportunity to coach the U.S. Men's National Team," Kiraly said. "I've watched with respect and admiration for everyone in the program as they've pursued excellence, both in training and in competition. This opportunity shines even brighter as I fondly recall the nine seasons I spent as a player with the program."

Kiraly is considered one of the greatest volleyball players ever. He won two Olympic gold medals in indoor volleyball (1984, 1988) and one in beach volleyball (1996). He was selected the greatest volleyball player of the 20th century by the FIVB and has been inducted into several halls of fame, including the International Volleyball Hall of Fame (2001), the United States Olympic & Paralympic Hall of Fame (2008) and the UCLA Hall of Fame (1992).

"All of us at USA Volleyball recognize that our record of success in the sport began when Karch led Team USA to the gold medal in 1984," Speraw said. "I think it is fitting that when Karch steps onto the court at the LA Olympics, he will be competing with the men's team one more time."

"Karch will not only bring his experience, skills and knowledge of the game to a team riding high going into a new Olympic & Paralympic quad, but he can also be a part of the game where he began his career with USA Volleyball as a Men's National Team player," said USA Volleyball Board of Directors Chair Dave Gentile.

What is the importance of the Badger Region?

What is the Badger Region? If you were to compare it to the structure of the U.S. government, USA Volleyball operates at a federal level and the Regions would operate at the state level. Regions have to follow the lead of USA Volleyball on lots of policies, but can set up the infrastructure at the local level that is best for each part of the country.

When someone has a concern, they contact their Region office.

If there are athletes that want to play and just compete at the local level, the Region can direct them to those resources. If they want to travel the country and compete on the national stage, Regions can point athletes and coaches to those types of opportunities, too.

Regional Volleyball Associations, like the Badger Region, are the grassroots, localized, customer-support hubs throughout the country. USA Volleyball sets the standards, structure and the framework that the 40 Regions of USA Volleyball operate within.

USA Volleyball is also the only entity in the United States that can send a team to the Olympics, NORCECA or other FIVB Championship Events.

The Regions work very closely with the clubs because the clubs are working with athletes, coaches and officials in the community. Regions are on the ground level where that 10-year-old gets his first serve over the net, or where an official advances to her next level or where a coach receives mentoring that helps them guide future ballers.

Are your program's jerseys compliant?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association wants to make sure your team's jerseys are compliant with all rule sets and changes that have gone into effect.

To do so, the Region's Ref Chair is encouraging club directors or coaches to send images if there is any concern that numbers are not contrasting enough with the dominant color of the jersey or if a jersey is not contrasting for libero purposes. The photos of the jerseys should not be of any junior athlete in uniform.

Reminder: All numbers must clearly contrast with the color of the jersey, regardless of the color of the outline of the number. If your team plans to attend a USA Volleyball Boys or Girls Qualifier or National Championship, the Region can also help direct you as to the proper channels you must go through to get jersey waivers.



Region to host 2025 All-Star event

Madison chosen for elite tournament

The Badger Region Volleyball Association and the Madison Area Sports Commission (MASC) are proud to announce that Madison and the Alliant Energy Center have been selected to host the 2025 USA Volleyball All-Star Championships. The event will feature All-Star teams from across the country composed of boys and girls players, ages 13-19, as well as officials from around the nation.

Madison was selected from various sites around the country by the participating programs. It will be the first time a Wisconsin city has hosted this prestigious event since 2010, when it was held in Wisconsin Dells.

"We are very proud to be hosting this event in Madison, in partnership with the Madison Area Sports Commission," said Badger Region Volleyball Executive Director and Commissioner Jennifer Armson-Dyer. "Wisconsin is a hotbed of volleyball at all levels, and to be able to bring this event to our local community is very rewarding. The All-Star Championships started in the early 2000s as an elite-level event designed to showcase regional All-Star teams along with national training teams from USA Volleyball, the national governing body of volleyball in the United States, in multiple age divisions. Previously known as the High Performance Championships, the USA Volleyball All-Star Championships are now run by the Regional Volleyball Associations and it is endorsed by USA Volleyball as a "pipeline" event to the National Team Development and Olympic programs.

Badger Region has been a participant in this event since its beginning, capturing 15 medals, including most recently a bronze medal by the U13 girls team last July in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and a gold medal by the U17 boys and U17 girls teams in 2022 in Tulsa, Okla. The 2024 All-Star Volleyball Championships will be held in Des Moines, Iowa in mid-July. Information about the Badger Region Volleyball tryouts for the 2024 teams will be announced in January.

How is the Badger Region Board structured?


The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve fouryear terms.


Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities). The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.
