AVCA names national coach/club directors of the year

The American Volleyball Coaches Association has announced the Club Awards for the 2023-24 season. The AVCA Club Awards program, now in its ninth year, recognizes deserving coaches and club directors in the youth/club volleyball community.

Badger Region is well represented on many of these lists.

Earning the AVCA Boys Club Director of the Year honors is Cooper Kemnitz, the boys director of Madison Inferno Volleyball Club.

In addition, the AVCA chose Mary Blandino, the boys 12s coach at Milwaukee Sting Volleyball Club, as the boys coach of the year.

Winning AVCA Region 6 Coach of the Year is Caitie Ratkowski, head coach of the Divine Saviors Holy Angel High School in Milwaukee. DSHA won the WIAA Div. I state title this year in girls volleyball.

Former Marquette University women's coach Meghan Keck (now a coach at First Alliance) received the Girls 18 Coach of Year.

The AVCA honors a Club Director of the Year in all seven girls age divisions (12s-18s), a Beach Club Director of the Year, a Boys Club Director of the Year, and a Boys Coach of the Year. All of the Club Director of the Year honorees will be recognized Dec. 19 during a banquet at the 2024 AVCA Convention in Louisville. Club Coach of the Year honorees will be celebrated during the High School and Club Coaches Recognition event, also at Convention.

Applications are due by Friday, Dec. 20. Coaches are required to attend their respective age group/gender's tryout, participate in the one-day training sessions, work the overnight camp and coach at the 2025 USA All-Star Championships in Madison this summer.

Coaching applications are required for any individual interested in working at a:

- * Training date
- * Overnight camp
- * All-Star Tournament

All of the above listed are paid opportunities. All coaches are independent contractors who must sign an independent contractor agreement and agree to the Region's All-Star Expectations and Philosophies.

If you are interested in volunteering at a tryout for the Badger Region High Performance All-Star program, please email brian@badgervolleyball.org.

All levels of coaches are encouraged to apply. That includes college coaches, high school coaches and club coaches. The only requirements are that the individual has a membership, SafeSport,

background screening and IMPACT certification.

Coaches not selected for camp or travel team obligations will still benefit from networking and observation opportunities with experienced HP All-Star coaches in the Badger Region.

The potential schedule for this year's All-Star program is as follows:

- * Feb. 28 (possible girls tryouts at the Baird Center in Milwaukee prior to the Badger Region Girls Qualifier)
- * March 21 (possible boys tryouts at the Baird Center in Milwaukee prior to the Dale Rohde Memorial)
- * One-day training sessions (two weekend dates in April or May at sites to be announced)

* Overnight camp will fall two days between July 13-18 at a college or university to be named soon.

* July 23: Report/practice date in Madison

* July 24-27: Competition in Madison.

In addition to a coaching salary, staff will receive per diem for food, a Badger backpack, free hotel and lots of Badger Region apparel and swag items.

Madson named to AVCA board

Curtis Madson, the head men's volleyball coach at Concordia Wisconsin, will join the AVCA Board of Directors.

Madson is also the Metro Milwaukee representative on the Badger Region Board of Directors and the Board Secretary.

He becomes the Division III Men's Representative, appointed to replace Kyle Exline who was elected to the spot this October but recently took a job at Division I Loyola Chicago. Based on Exline being unopposed during the recent election, the vacant Division III Men's spot is filled by appointment.

Madson took over at Concordia prior to the 2018 season, and he has built the program from the ground up. The

Falcons have made steady progress across seven seasons, reaching the .500 mark in 2022 and winning a Concordia-best 15 matches in 2023.

A Wisconsin native and former college volleyball player at Carthage College, Madson has played an important role in helping grow the boys and men's games in the state. He and Badger Region Communication and Program Director Brian Sharkey founded Southport Volleyball Club in 2008, and by the time he left, they had five teams competing regionally and nationally.

Beginning Jan. 1, 2025, Madson will be one of eight new members of the Board, which includes a blend of elected representatives and appointed members.

USAV joins Body Confident Sport effort

USA Volleyball is proud to announce its collaboration with Body Confident Sport and Laureus USA to help girls build body confidence and foster an inclusive, supportive environment in sports. The partnership aims to ensure that girls not only feel they belong in sports but also thrive in an atmosphere that encourages self-esteem and resilience.

Body Confident Sport is an innovative, scientifically-backed program designed to promote body positivity among girls aged 11-17. Developed in collaboration with leading global experts— including the Centre for Appearance Research and the Tucker Center for Research on Girls & Women in Sport— the program incorporates insights from girls and coaches across six countries. Body Confident Sport equips coaches with a comprehensive toolkit to lead impactful, confidence-building discussions that empower young athletes.

USA Volleyball is already piloting the Body Confident Sport initiative at girls

clubs nationwide and has integrated it into its National Team Development Program Training Series. With a two-year grant from Laureus Sport for Good, the program will be made available to all regions and clubs in 2025. Body Confident Sport is designed to be delivered through in-person, small group discussions where girls have a safe space to share their experiences and concerns about body image. Coaches, who undergo training via a self-guided program, will lead these discussions and encourage positive dialogue that promotes a healthy relationship with body image.

“Volleyball is currently the most popular team sport for high school girls in the U.S., and it’s our goal to continue growing the sport,” said USA Volleyball Director of Education Services Dr. Jenny Johnson. “Unfortunately, around the world, teenage girls drop out of sports at twice the rate of boys, often because of low body confidence. With this program, we can give girls the tools to build positive body image and feel confident on and off the court.”

Chicago suburb to host Volleyball Nations League

The world’s premier volleyball competition is returning to the United States in 2025 as two cities will host preliminary rounds of the Volleyball Nations League.

VNL annually brings together the best teams and players from around the world for four weeks of competition. Eighteen teams in each gender will play 12 matches during three weeks of preliminary competition. The top teams then play each other for gold, silver and bronze in the VNL Final Round.

The top men’s teams return to the Chicago area in 2025, as the NOW Arena in Hoffman Estates, Ill., will host a men’s preliminary phase June 25-29, 2025. The city last hosted the VNL in 2019.

Elite players from the United States, Poland, Brazil, Italy, Canada and China will compete in Hoffman Estates over five days. With the U.S. and Poland competing, VNL Chicago will host two of the three medalists from the 2024 Olympic Games.

² **Female Only** - Players who were born on or after July 1, 2006, (who are defined as 18 & under by the USAV Age Definition) and are in the 11th grade for the current academic year are eligible to compete in 17 & under. (This exception is based on recruiting concerns for 11th grade girls previously required to participate in girls 18’s qualifiers and the 18’s GJNC.)

³ **Male Only** - Players who were born on or after July 1, 2010, OR players who were born on or after July 1, 2009 (15 years or younger) who shall neither have completed nor are in a grade higher than the eighth (8th) grade during the current academic year **are eligible to play in the 14 & Under division**. This exception is based on the net height difference of 7’4 1/8” to 7’11 5/8” between the 14 and Under Division to the 15 and Under Division.

⁴ **Male Only** - Players who were born on or after July 1, 2010 (14 years or younger) who shall neither have completed nor are in a grade higher than the seventh grade (7th) during the current academic year are eligible for a Region approved waiver to compete in the boys 13’s age group.

⁵ **Male Only** - Players who were born on or after July 1, 2011 (13 years or younger) who shall neither have completed nor are in a grade higher than the sixth grade (6th) during the current academic year are eligible for a Region approved waiver to compete in the boys 12’s age group.

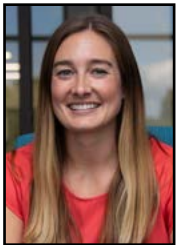
GET TO KNOW THE BADGER REGION

If you were to compare it to the structure of the U.S. government, USA Volleyball operates at a federal level and the Regions would operate at the state level. Regions have to follow the lead of USA Volleyball on lots of policies, but can set up the infrastructure at the local level that is best for each part of the country.

When someone has a concern, they contact their Region office.

If there are athletes that want to play and just compete at the local level, the Region can direct them to those resources. If they want to travel the country and compete on the national stage, Regions can point athletes and coaches to those types of opportunities, too.

Regional Volleyball Associations, like the Badger Region, are the grassroots, localized, customer-support hubs throughout the country.

USA Volleyball sets the standards, structure and the framework that the 40 Regions of USA Volleyball operate within.

USA Volleyball is also the only entity in the United States that can send a team to the Olympics, NORCECA or other FIVB Championship Events.

The Regions work very closely with the clubs because the clubs are working with athletes, coaches and officials in the community.

Regions are on the ground level where that 10-year-old gets his first serve over the net, or where an official advances to her next level or where a coach receives mentoring that helps them guide future ballers.

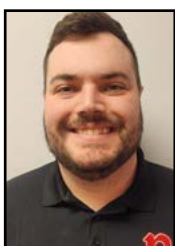

'Caught Doing Good' now in its third year

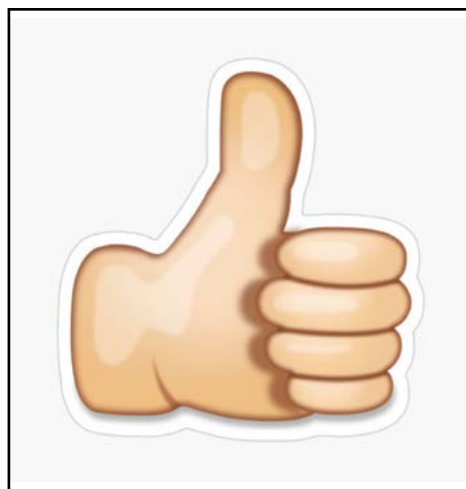
The Badger Region knows there are great people who play, coach or officiate our great sport in the state of Wisconsin.

Madison chosen for elite tournament

The Badger Region Volleyball Association and the Madison Area Sports Commission (MASC) are proud to announce that Madison and the Alliant Energy Center have been selected to host the 2025 USA Volleyball All-Star Championships. The event will feature All-Star teams from across the country composed of boys and girls players, ages 13-19, as well as officials from around the nation.

Madison was selected from various sites around the country by the participating programs. It will be the first time a Wisconsin city has hosted this prestigious event since 2010, when it was held in Wisconsin Dells.

"We are very proud to be hosting this event in Madison, in partnership with the Madison Area Sports Commission," said Badger Region Volleyball Executive Director and Commissioner Jennifer Armson-Dyer. "Wisconsin is a hotbed of volleyball at all levels, and to be able to bring this event to our local community is very rewarding. We're looking forward to showing the juniors volleyball community what Madison is about."

The event will take place in late July 2025 at the Alliant Energy Center and will feature four days of competition across nine divisions of both boys and girls volleyball ages 13-19. More than 100 participating teams will come from the 40 regions of USA Volleyball along with international teams. In the past, teams from Canada, Puerto Rico, Australia and New Zealand have attended the event.

Not only will players, coaches and spectators travel from around the nation to Madison, but officials will as well. "Hosting this prestigious tournament in Madison -- one of the epicenters of volleyball has long been a goal of ours," said Jamie Patrick, VP of MASC. The All-Star Championships started in the early 2000s as an elite-level event designed to showcase regional All-Star teams along with national training teams from USA Volleyball, the national governing body of volleyball in the United States, in multiple age divisions. Previously known as the High Performance Champion-

ships, the USA Volleyball All-Star Championships are now run by the Regional Volleyball Associations and it is endorsed by USA Volleyball as a "pipeline" event to the National Team Development and Olympic programs.

Badger Region has been a participant in this event since its beginning, capturing 15 medals, including most recently a bronze medal by the U13 girls team last July in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and a gold medal by the U17 boys and U17 girls teams in 2022 in Tulsa, Okla. The 2024 All-Star Volleyball Championships will be held in Des Moines, Iowa in mid-July. Information about the Badger Region Volleyball tryouts for the 2024 teams will be announced in January.

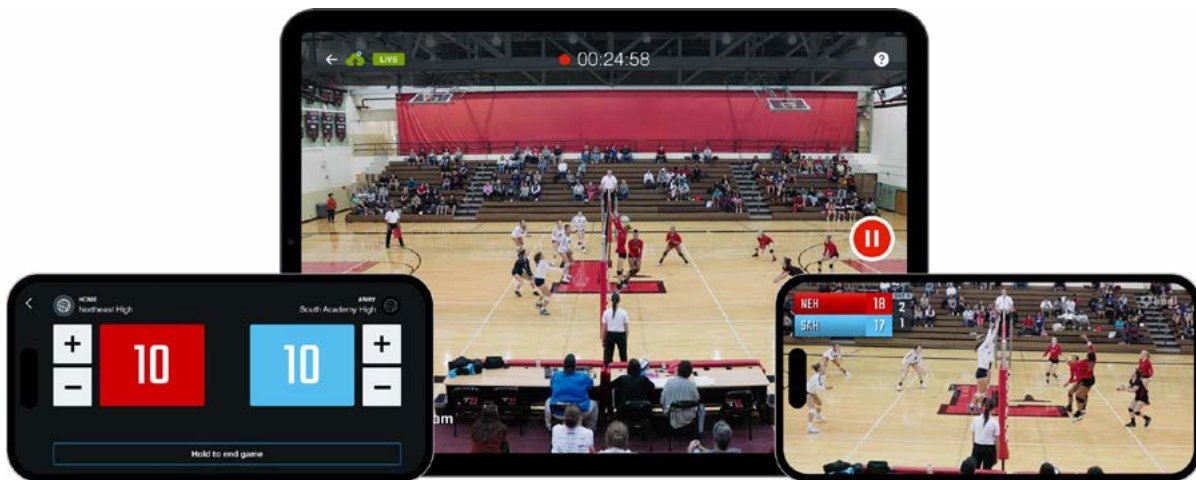

How is the Badger Region Board structured?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve four-year terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they

think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities).

The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.

You'll be hearing from each Board member twice a year in the form of a column in the Badger Beacon. Now, let's meet them:
