Volleyball Hall of Fame celebrates 130 years

Did you know that 2025 marks the 130th anniversary of volleyball? While February 9 is commonly believed to be the sport's official birthday, historical evidence suggests otherwise. In fact, William G. Morgan-volleyball's inventor—didn't arrive in Holyoke, Massachusetts, until August 30, 1895, as reported by newspapers of the time. Adding to the mystery, a fire at the Holyoke YMCA destroyed many of the original records, making it challenging to pinpoint the exact date volleyball was created.

The International Volleyball Hall of Fame (IVHF) is dedicated to honoring the legends, recognizing the greats, and preserving the history of volleyball. But to continue this important work,



support is needed.

The IVHF operates with just one full-time employee, relying heavily on the dedication of volunteers and interns. With a modest annual budget of \$400,000, the IVHF Museum is maintained, and numerous events are hosted to celebrate and educate the volleyball community.

To commemorate volleyball's 130th anniversary, a fundraising campaign has been launched to raise \$130,000 by May 15, 2025. These funds will help secure a matching grant from the state of

Massachusetts, allowing for:

- * The design of a new beach volleyball exhibit
- * Hiring an archivist to collect artifacts and stories that document the sport's global history
- * Preparations for volleyball's 150th anniversary in 2045

Any club, coach, official, or family member passionate about preserving volleyball's history is encouraged to contribute whatever they deem appropriate! However we encourage various regions to contribute \$130 or more in honor of this milestone. All contributors will receive special recognition at the 2025 RVA Meetings in Denver.

Make sure your jerseys are compliant before ordering

The Badger Region Volleyball Association wants to make sure your team's jerseys are compliant with all rule sets and changes that have gone into effect. To do so, the Region's Ref Chair is encouraging club directors or coaches to send images if there is any concern that numbers are not contrasting enough with the

dominant color of the jersey or if a jersey is not contrasting for libero purposes. The photos of the jerseys should not be of any junior athlete.

Reminder: All numbers must clearly contrast with the color of the jersey, regardless of the color of the outline of the number.

If your team plans to attend a USA Vol-

leyball Boys or Girls Qualifier or National Championship, the Region can also help direct you as to the proper channels you must go through to get jersey waivers.

Fiserv Forum to host Marquette/Wisconsin match Sept. 17

Fiserv Forum will host an NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball match between in-state rivals Marquette University and the University of Wisconsin on Wednesday, Sept. 17, 2025, in downtown Milwaukee.

Tickets for the match at the home of MU men's basketball and the NBA's Milwaukee Bucks will go on sale in late spring or early summer. Any questions can be directed to the Marquette Ticket Office by calling 414-288-4668 (GOMU) or email.

"We are excited to be back at

Fiserv Forum and showcase the high level of volleyball being played in this state," said now former Marquette head coach Ryan Theis. "Our match two years ago at the venue was record setting and the event is something our student-athletes and coaches will always remember. We are looking forward to another great turnout celebrating one of the fastest growing sports in the nation and our amazing fans at Marquette."

Theis announced on Feb. 17 that he is leaving Marquette to become the next head coach at the University of Florida. The Golden Eagles and Badgers played in front of 17,037 fans at Fiserv Forum on Sept. 13, 2023, still an NCAA attendance record for an indoor regular season game. It remains a state record for attendance at a women's sporting event and ranks as the 15th-most attended NCAA women's volleyball match ever (including NCAA tournament play).

The 2024 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship title match drew 1.3 million viewers on network television (ABC), while the tournament itself was the most-consumed ever as more than 1.3 billion minutes were watched across all ESPN platforms.

The two perennial NCAA tournament participants each advanced to NCAA regional competition last fall and the Badgers captured a national championship in 2021.

In addition to MU men's basketball games at Fiserv Forum, the building has partnered with Marquette to host the 2022 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship and will do so again with First & Second Round games on March 21-23 this spring

Special Olympics volleyball team seeks athletes

Special Olympics Wisconsin is looking for athletes to join its ranks.

The Wisconsin Bad-Pack (combination Badgers-Packers for the name) volleyball program came together in the year 2000 after a challenge was made by a Special Olympics Unified team from Indiana at the Special Olympics World Games after my Dad's (David Bigelow's) defeated the Unified team from Indiana.

A Special Olympics unified team is a team that consists of half the team members are individuals with an intellectual disability and the other half of the team consists of people without a disability. The players on the team from Indiana said that the players on my Dad's team were too good not to enter a team into the USA Volleyball Open National Championships.

In the year 2000 luckily, the National Championships were in Columbus, Ohio, so the team from Wisconsin could drive. Luckily, when we asked players if they wanted to play and were available over Memorial Day weekend, they surprisingly said, "yes." After asking a few other people to fill out the side of the roster without disabilities. The Bad-Pack headed off to Columbus not knowing what to expect. The team finished that tournament in third place and a record of 6-1.

The Bad-Pack volleyball competed at the USA Volleyball Open National Championships every year from 2000-2019. Over that time span, the team has won five National Championships including a 3-peat from 2011-2013. The Bad-Pack also had a stretch where the team played in the Championship match 11 years in a row.

The Bad-Pack volleyball team was the first Special Olympics Unified team in the state of Wisconsin. We are also the only Unified volleyball team in Wisconsin.

COVID has been tough on the Bad-Pack team. The Special Olympics Unified part of the Open was canceled from 2020-2022. In 2023 a couple of the team's longtime players decided it was the right time to stop playing and it has been hard to replace them ever since.

In 2025, the Bad-Pack volleyball would really like to get back on track and have a team back at the Open in Denver representing Wisconsin.

The hard part is over the years is that our returning players have gotten really good at volleyball, so we cannot just go out and ask anyone to play. A perspective player has to have some volleyball skills. A player doesn't have to be the best player or the tallest or the fastest player.

The team is trying to find a setter that is familiar with a 5/1 offense and a libero.

Even though most of the team is made up

of players that live in the Milwaukee area, the team practices at a school in Watertown.

The team practices now through Memorial Day Weekend. Memorial Day Weekend is when the USA Volleyball Open National Championships takes place in Denver, Colo.

A perspective player would have to be available that weekend.

The requirements to play are simple Special Olympics requires a simple liability waiver that gets filled out once and USA Volleyball requires a waiver every year.

- * Otherwise, someone just needs to have a good attitude.
- * Be willing to except a role because my dad will use all of his subs.
- * Looking into playing something other than coed recreational volleyball.
- * Be available a few Sundays from about 10 a.m. to about 1 p.m. for practice.
 - * Be ready to laugh a lot.
- * We can't offer someone a weekly match but at the Open a volleyball player from Wisconsin is going to bump into many people that they know.

This year, the USA Volleyball Open National Championships take place May 22-25 Denver.



UNIFORM

- * A player's uniform consists of a jersey and shorts or athletic sports pants.
- * The color and design for the jerseys and shorts or athletic/sports pants must be uniform for the team (except for the Libero).
- * It is forbidden to wear uniforms of a color different from that of the other players (except for the Liberos), and/or without official numbers.
- * Compression pads (padded injury protection devices such as elbow pads and knee pads and compression sleeves) may be worn for protection or support. The color of the compression pads does not need to be the same for the team members, nor does the color need to match the predominant color(s) of the uniform.
- * For nationally sanctioned competition, uniforms must be identical except for sleeve length and the Libero players.
- * Socks, sport shoes, knee pads, an compression pads are not part of the uniform.
- * Uniform bottoms of different lengths are allowed, as long as the colors match.
- * The shoes must be light and pliable with rubber or composite soles.


LIBERO UNIFORM

- * The Libero must wear a jersey that clearly contrasts with, and has a different dominant color from, the jersey of their teammates.
- * The Liberos' uniform bottom does not need to match their teammates uniform bottoms.
- * The Libero jersey number shall meet all Jersey Number specifications.
- * When two Liberos are used, both Libros can be in uniforms different from each other and from the rest of the team.

HEADBANDS/

UNDERSHIRTS. UNDERGARMENTS AND TIGHTS

If undergarments, including but not limited to T-shirts, boxer shorts, tights, leotards, body suits, bicycle shorts, sports bras, etc., are worn in such a manner that they are exposed, they will be considered a part of the uniform. In that case they must be similar and the same color for any team members (except the Libero) who wear such an undergarment



JERSEY NUMBER

- * The players' jerseys must be numbered in a permanent manner from 1 to 99 using Arabic numerals.
- Duplicate numbers are not allowed.
- * Uniform numbers must be clearly visible and centered side to side on the front and back of the jersey.
- * Numbers are recommended to be placed on the upper half of the jersey and must not extend below the players waist or tucked into the uniform bottom.
- * Each jersey must use the same color and number height for all players, except the Libero's jersey, which may have different colored and sized numbers, provided it still meets the minimum size criteria.
- * The color and brightness of the numbers must contrast with the color and brightness of the iersev. Irrespective of any border around the number.
- * Color combinations including but not limited to purple/black, dark green/black, navy/black, white/ light yellow, or navy/maroon are not distinctive enough to comply with the rules.
- * The numbers must be a minimum of 10 cm (4") in height on the chest and a minimum of 15 cm (6") in height on the back. (It is recommended that the numbers be a minimum of 15 cm (6") in height on the front and a minimum of 20 cm (8") on the back.
- * The stripe forming the numbers shall be a minimum of 2 cm (3/4") in width throughout

MISCELLANEOUS


* A single manufacturer's logo or trademark on the outside of the jerseys or shorts, provided that the

logo or trademark does not exceed 14.6 square cm (2.25 square inches) is allowed.

* Sponsor logos are permitted provided they are identical on each uniform and do not obstruct the view of the uniform number.



* No restrictions.



- AND PROHIBITED ITEMS
- * Players may wear glasses or lenses at their own risk.
- * A head covering made from cloth or soft, non-abrasive fabric may be worn.
- * Hats of any style are not permitted.
- * A guard or brace, or headgear, are permitted; padding or a covering may be necessary.
- * It is prohibited to wear a cast, even if padded.
- * A prosthetic limb(s) is permitted; sharp edges need to be wrapped or padded to ensure safety.
- * Jewelry may be worn provided its nature does not present a concern for safety, such as extremely long necklaces and/or necklaces with large medallions, or large hoop earrings.

Region to host 2025 All-Star event

Madison chosen for elite tournament

The Badger Region Volleyball Association and the Madison Area Sports Commission (MASC) are proud to announce that Madison and the Alliant Energy Center have been selected to host the 2025 USA Volleyball All-Star Championships. The event will feature All-Star teams from across the country composed of boys and girls players, ages 13-19, as well as officials from around the nation.

Madison was selected from various sites around the country by the participating programs. It will be the first time a Wisconsin city has hosted this prestigious event since 2010, when it was held in Wisconsin Dells.

"We are very proud to be hosting this event in Madison, in partnership with the Madison Area Sports Commission," said Badger Region Volleyball Executive Director and Commissioner Jennifer Armson-Dyer. "Wisconsin is a hotbed of volleyball at all levels, and to be able to bring this event to our local community is very rewarding. We're looking forward to showing the juniors volleyball community what Madison is about."

The event will take place in late July 2025 at the Alliant Energy Center and will feature four days of competition across nine divisions of both boys and girls volleyball ages 13-19. "Hosting this prestigious tournament in Madison -- one of the epicenters of volleyball has long been a goal of ours," said Jamie Patrick, VP of MASC. The All-Star Championships started in the early 2000s as an elite-level event designed to showcase regional All-Star teams along with national training teams from USA Volleyball, the national governing body of volleyball in the United States, in multiple age divisions. Previously known as the High Performance Champion-

ships, the USA Volleyball All-Star Championships are now run by the Regional Volleyball Associations and it is endorsed by USA Volleyball as a "pipeline" event to the National Team Development and Olympic programs.

Badger Region has been a participant in this event since its beginning, capturing 15 medals, including most recently a bronze medal by the U13 girls team last July in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and a gold medal by the U17 boys and U17 girls teams in 2022 in Tulsa, Okla. The 2024 All-Star Volleyball Championships will be held in Des Moines, Iowa in mid-July. Information about the Badger Region Volleyball tryouts for the 2024 teams will be announced in January.



How is the Badger Region Board structured?

The Badger Region Volleyball Association is governed by a Board of Directors that must be elected by members on a regular basis. Area reps serve three-year terms, while members of the executive board serve four-year terms.

Members, whether they are players, coaches, parents, directors, athletic trainers or officials, are encouraged to communicate with their respective representative if they

think policies or financial decision in the Region need to be changed.

Some policies enforced by Badger Region come from USA Volleyball, our sport's national governing body, so those can't be changed. But many others can.

The Board is advised by a 11 chairpersons (or experts) in various parts of the game, and five staff members (some of which have multiple responsibilities).

The state is divided into five parts geographically for representation. Plus, there are two at-large board members who you can approach if you don't feel comfortable with your current rep. And there is a rep dedicated just to issues that surround our Junior volleyball clubs and athletes.


